From the Pastor

Redeemed by God

We often wonder about the purposefulness of what we do, about the meaning of life and existence. We are looking for our goal, the star to which we are heading, we want to draw a straight line on how we are to go through life. We are not aware of the purposefulness and causality of our actions and intentions.

Why? Well, we are tied up in the treadmill of work, duties, where causality prevails over effect. Intentions precede actions. In fact, they should go in the right order: I intend, I do, I implement, and I use. We live in times when everything happens too quickly and too nervously, to the detriment of ourselves. And it is enough to enter the system of God's preaching, intentions, plans, and it will immediately become much calmer, we will feel unity leading to one goal, this goal will help us go through life.

Too difficult? God's plan has always assumed great love for people, hence what was, is and will be, is justified in our lives and actions. This plan has always assumed our unfaithfulness, our idolatry, which is why God -through his chosen one - descended to Earth taking the form of a human being, and therefore He chose her as the Mother of the Son, and at the same time, of God. He knew very well that Mary would submit to the will of the Lord, would not protest, and would even accept this gift as her goal in life. "But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship." (Galatians 4:4-5) The redeemed are we who are here and now, and also those who were and will be. Exclusively and always: "So you are no longer a slave, but God's child; and since you are his child, God has made you also an heir." (Galatians 4:7).

It was her Parenthood that was Mary's goal, life, duty, and love. She understood very quickly and prudently what Motherhood means in her version, because she became not only the Mother of God, but also of our entire Church, so it is double the responsibility and seriousness. And realizing this, hearing all that was said around her, She "treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart." (Luke 2:19).

Well that's nice, someone will say, but all this does not apply to me. I will no longer be the Mother of God, and I do not feel able to realize myself, like the ancients. Now, we have less time, more activities, I am not suitable for this ... Mistake. Let's consider the above verses, let's think about our lives, maybe we will find something in ourselves that will allow us to find the rhythm, the line of our life plan, as the Mother did. At the beginning, let's start with the small, everyday things. Then, maybe we will slowly come to bigger ones, those important, real, and purposeful for us. It will work, it just takes some patience.



Słowo Proboszcza

Wykupieni przez Boga

Nierzadko zastanawiamy się nad celowością tego, co robimy, nad sensem życia i istnienia. Szukamy swego celu, tej gwiazdki, do której zmierzamy, chcemy sobie wytyczyć prostą, po której mamy przejść przez życie. Nie zdajemy sobie sprawy z celowości i przyczynowości naszych działań i zamierzeń.

Dlaczego? Otóż jesteśmy uwiązani w kieracie pracy, obowiązków, gdzie przyczynowość góruje nad skutkiem. Zamierzenia wyprzedzają czyny. A właściwie powinny one iść w szyku właściwym: zamierzam, czynię, realizuję i korzystam. Żyjemy w czasach, gdy wszystko dzieje się za szybko, za nerwowo, nierzadko byle jak, ze szkodą dla nas samych. A wystarczy wejść w system Bożego przepowiadania, zamysłów, planów, a od razu robi się o wiele spokojniej, pocujemy jedność prowadzącą do jednego celu, ten cel pomoże nam przy przejściu przez życie.

Za trudne? Plan Boży od zawsze zakładał wielką miłość do ludzi, stąd to co było, jest i będzie ma swoje uzasadnienie w naszym życiu i postępkach. Ten plan zakładał od zawsze naszą niewierność, nasze bałwochwalstwo, dlatego Bóg – poprzez swoją wybrankę – zszedł na ziemię przybrawszy postać człowieka, dlatego też to ją obrał jako Rodzicielkę Syna, a zarazem Boga. Wiedział dobrze, że Maryja podda się woli Pana, nie będzie protestować, wręcz przyjmie ten dar jako swój cel życia. „Gdy jednak nadeszła pełnia czasu, zesłał Bóg Syna swego, zrodzonego z niewiasty, zrodzonego pod Prawem, aby wykupił tych, którzy podlegali Prawu, abyśmy mogli otrzymać przybrane synostwo.” (Ga 4,4-5) Wykupieni to my, którzy tutaj i teraz jesteśmy, ale również i ci, którzy byli i będą. Wyłącznie i zawsze: „nie jesteś już niewolnikiem, lecz synem. Jeżeli zaś synem, to i dziedzicem z woli Bożej.” (Ga 4,6-7).

To Jej Rodzicielstwo było dla Maryi celem, życiem, obowiązkiem i miłością. Pojęła bardzo szybko i rozważnie, co oznacza Macierzyństwo w Jej wydaniu, bowiem została nie tylko Matką Boga, ale zarazem całego naszego Kościoła, więc podwójna odpowiedzialność i powaga. A zdając sobie z tego sprawę, słysząc wszystko, o czym wokół mówiono, Ona „zachowywała wszystkie te sprawy i rozważała je w swoim sercu.” (Łk 2,18-19).

No fajnie, ktoś powie, ale to wszystko mnie nie dotyczy, Matką Boga już nie będę, a sam(a) nie czuję się w stanie realizować, tak jak ci starożytni, teraz mamy mniej czasu, więcej zajęć, ja do tego się nie nadaję... Błąd. Rozważmy powyższe wersety, zastanówmy się nad swoim życiem, może jednak znajdziemy w sobie to coś, co pozwoli nam znaleźć ten rytm, tę linię planu naszego życia, jak to zrobiła Rodzicielka. Na początku zacznijmy od tych małych, codziennych spraw, a może powoli dojdziemy do większych, tych dla nas ważnych, prawdziwych, celowych. Uda się, tylko potrzeba trochę wytrwałości.

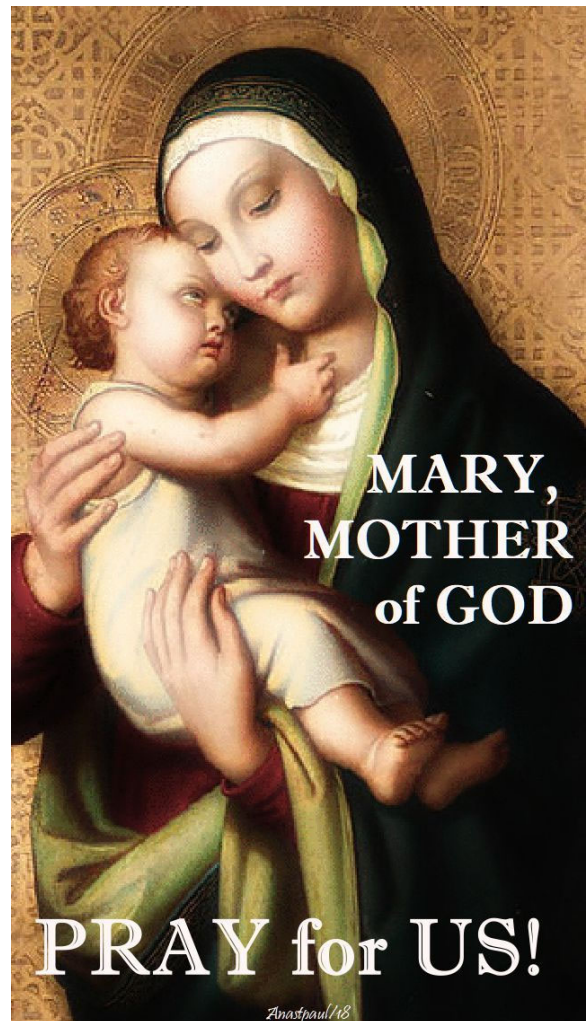

Second Week of Christmas

Sunday, January 1st this year, New Year's Day, is the **Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God**. In addition, it is a celebration of the **World Day of Prayer for Peace**.

Monday is the **Memorial of Saint Basil the Great and Saint Gregory Nazianzen, bishops and doctors of the Church**. Wednesday is the **Memorial of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton**. Thursday is the **Memorial of Saint John Neumann**.

The Epiphany of the Lord is celebrated on January 6th in most of the world. It is celebrated on Sunday, the 8th in the U.S. The light has come into the darkness of the world and our salvation was made known to the Gentiles. **Matthew's Gospel** brings us the story of the Magi and their encounter with Herod on the way to "do homage" to the newborn King of the Jews.

The first reading during the week continues from the **First Letter of John**, encouraging us to make our home in the one who makes his home in us. In Jesus, we have eternal life and we are called to love one another.

The Gospels for this week show Jesus manifesting himself in his life on earth, following **John's Gospel**, from the testimony of John, to the calling of Jesus' disciples from their everyday lives.

Sunday is the celebration of the **Epiphany of the Lord in the U.S. It is the Baptism of the Lord in the rest of the world**.

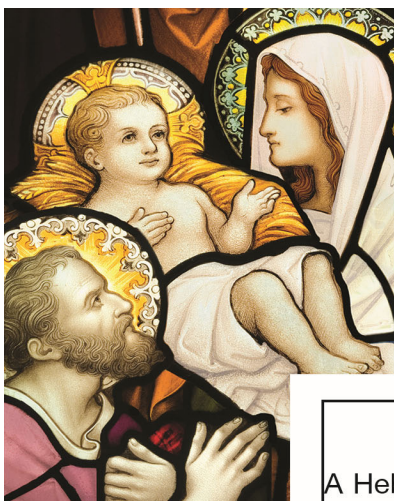
Daily Prayer This Week

This second week of the Christmas Season can be a great help for our daily connections with our Lord. We have the full and wonderful Solemnity in honor of Mary, in her role as "Mother of God." We can ask her to be our guide all week as we desire to grow closer to her Son. We can read Pope Francis' words for the World Day of Prayer for Peace and ponder them from time to time this week.

As we go through our daily, and often very busy lives in these days after Christmas, we can continue a sense of this brief season by continuing to ask that our Lord come to us in the ways we still need light and healing and peace. For some of us, this will be an easy prayer this week. Waiting faithfully can continue into the Christmas Season.

A special grace to ask for this week would be the gift of celebrating our Lord's presence with us. We can ask for it every morning, as we get going and we can enter into brief conversations with our Lord, in the background, as we encounter some of the places in our life in which we can see more hope, more of an opportunity for peace. This week, we might hold up each member of our family, close friends and neighbors, and those we might work with, seeing and celebrating how our Lord is manifest in them. For some of us, there may be real epiphany moments, when we see what we haven't been seeing, feel what we haven't been feeling or experience a call we haven't felt before. Being watchful for and open to these special post-Christmas moments of grace is very important.

For those of us in the Northern Hemisphere, these days are short and darkness comes early. Perhaps we can light a candle every evening this week at dinner just to celebrate the Light of Jesus that comes into the darkness of our lives. In the Southern Hemisphere, there is so much light, we can rejoice with it.

SHALOM

A Hebrew word that many people are familiar with is *shalom*, commonly translated into English as “peace.” However, the word is much richer, deeper, and broader than that. As a matter of fact, when the blessing in today’s first reading concludes with *shalom*, it serves as a summary of the entire blessing: *shalom* is God’s wholeness, well-being, longevity, harmony, as well as God’s peace. Perhaps Mary prayed this blessing while she found herself in the midst of angels, shepherds, and—quite likely, thanks to the shepherds—inquisitive neighbors who had been told of the wondrous birth. Perhaps she prayed for God’s *shalom* not only for herself, but also for her child as she reflected on his birth. As we stand at the threshold of a new year, we can likewise pray this blessing, with Mary as our example, pondering the mysteries of Christ in our hearts, praying for the richness, depth, and breadth of God’s *shalom*.

MARY THE CAREGIVER

At some point in time, most people will find themselves needing to watch over another person. This is true for parents and children of course; for others, perhaps an aging parent or spouse; a friend or neighbor living alone after surgery. At these times, along with the caregiving of the moment, there is often a focus on the future, a wondering about what will come. Quite naturally for the new mother Mary there is this future focus, with many possibilities for her to hold in her heart. She reflects quietly in the midst of the very hectic series of events that follow the birth of her child: hurrying shepherds who go and tell the wondrous news to others, then those others sharing their amazement. Luke tells us that Mary keeps all of this, and reflects on it in her heart. Mary is watching over Jesus as mothers do, watching over each and every moment.

GOD THE CAREGIVER

As Mary watches over her child, so did Israel pray for God to watch over them and one another, to bless and keep them, as Mary kept and reflected on things in her heart. Mary’s face surely shone upon the infant Jesus, as Israel prayed for God’s face to shine upon them with that graciousness we also know in her whom we call “full of grace.” At the conclusion of the blessing in today’s first reading is a prayer for God to look on us in kindness and, even more, to grant us peace. It may be in this final line of the blessing that we see God most at work in the face and the care of Mary, gazing gently on her child, wishing the fullness of God’s *shalom* for Jesus and his future. Our mission as disciples is to show the divine care we hear in the blessing prayer, and to live out the care-giving we see today in Mary.

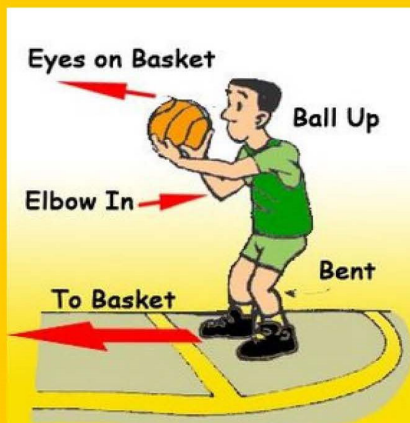

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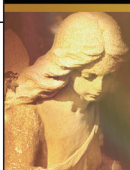


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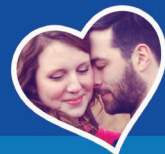
