From the Pastor

Works of Light, Works of Darkness

The French Revolution was to overthrow the royal regime and become a splendor of enlightenment for the whole world. Is it not symbolic that the deputies who gathered in the meeting rooms often suffered from inflammation of the eyes due to poor airing, and the Count of Mirabeau Gabriel Riqueti, one of the leaders, even spoke blindfolded? Blind Enlightenment! In five months, 2217 people were executed by guillotine in Paris alone. And all this to relieve the poorest in society! As Bernard Lewis said, the French have survived two empires, two monarchies, two dictatorships and five republics since the revolution, and one cannot be sure that they have achieved the ideal of democracy. Even the most sincere will of justice without God included will turn into terror. We cannot be human without God or do anything good without Him. Our actions without the Holy Spirit's fire quickly lose their luster and become a darkness that terrifies even ourselves.

When Jesus told his disciples to be the light of the world, he did not give them tasks to fulfill on their own strength, but he wanted them to allow the Spirit give light to humanity. It is no accident that the sign of fiery tongues appears only after the sending of the Spirit. They were like lamps capable of giving light. But without the Spirit, we are only lamps without oil and without fire. Zeal is not created alone, it must be given.

The true revolution that illuminates humanity is the proclamation of the Gospel, which is addressed first to the poorest and those who live in darkness. I was always intrigued by Jesus' words that my actions should shine so that people would praise not me, but God. A good deed, full of light, is supposed to put me in the shadows so that God can be seen in the light. Each of my religious acts, especially enlightenment with evangelism, is to put me in the deepest shadow so that the light of God can enter people without any aberrations.

Słowo Proboszcza

Czyny światła, czyny ciemności

Francuska rewolucja miała obalić reżim królewski i stać się blaskiem oświecenia dla całego świata. Czy nie jest symboliczne to, że deputowani, którzy zbierali się w sali posiedzeń, często chorowali na zapalenie oczu z powodu słabego wietrzenia, a Mirabeau, jeden z przywódców, nawet przemawiał z zawiązanymi, zaropiałymi oczami? Ślepe oświecenie! W ciągu pięciu miesięcy zginęło na gilotynie w samym Paryżu 2217 osób. A wszystko po to, by ulżyć najuboższym! Jak powiedział Bernard Lewis, Francuzi od czasów rewolucji przeżyli dwa cesarstwa, dwie monarchie, dwie dyktatury i pięć republik, i wcale nie można być pewnym, czy osiągnęli ideał demokracji. Nawet najszczęśliwsza wola sprawiedliwości bez pomocy Boga wyrodnieje w terror. Nie jesteśmy w stanie bez Boga być ludzcy ani uczynić cokolwiek dobrego. Nasze czyny bez ognia Ducha Świętego szybko tracą blask i stają się mrokiem przerażającym nawet nas samych.

Kiedy Jezus mówił do uczniów, aby byli światłem świata, nie stawiał im zadania, które mieli wypełnić o własnych siłach, lecz pragnął, aby oni pozwolili Duchowi obdarowywać światłem ludzkość. Nie jest przypadkiem znak ognistych języków objawiający się dopiero po zesłaniu Ducha. Byli jak lampy zdolne do dawania światła. Ale bez Ducha jesteśmy tylko lampami bez oliwy i bez ognia. Zapału nie wzbudza się samemu, musi być on udzielony.

Prawdziwą rewolucją oświecającą ludzkość jest głoszenie Ewangelii, która jest adresowana na pierwszym miejscu do najuboższych i żyjących w ciemnościach. Zawsze intrygowały mnie słowa Jezusa o tym, by tak świeciły moje czyny, aby ludzie chwalili nie mnie, tylko Boga. Dobry czyn, pełen światła, ma mnie samego postawić w cieniu, by widoczny był Bóg w świetle. Każdy mój religijny akt, a szczególnie oświecanie ewangelizacją, ma mnie stawiać w najgłębszym cieniu, by światło Boga przedostawało się do ludzi bez żadnych aberracji.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I recently decided to learn to cook. As I sit at the feet of various YouTube cooking masters, I notice how much of cooking is adding ingredients that don't provide any more nourishment, like herbs and other seasonings. But man! They make all the difference because they make the meal delightful to eat and share.

Jesus calls his disciples "salt of the world." No one eats just salt. So, Christians are not meant to replace or do away with the world. They are meant to be agents of preservation and glorification. Notice how often these days the Church seeks to preserve what is threatened: the goodness of marital and family love, the desires of young people for greatness, the value of honest work, healthy economics, and altruistic political engagement, the dignity of the poor and vulnerable. Over and over, we say to a world who wants to throw things out, "It's worth saving! We'll preserve it! We'll show you it's wonderful." If we can't engage the world like that, Jesus says we are the ones who get thrown out, because salt alone is worthless.

Jesus only asks us to do for others what he does for us. He is the "salt" of everything in our lives. Is there something in your life starting to rot a bit? Something tasting bland and boring? Let Jesus salt it and see if you like it better.

Reading 2: 1 2:1-5

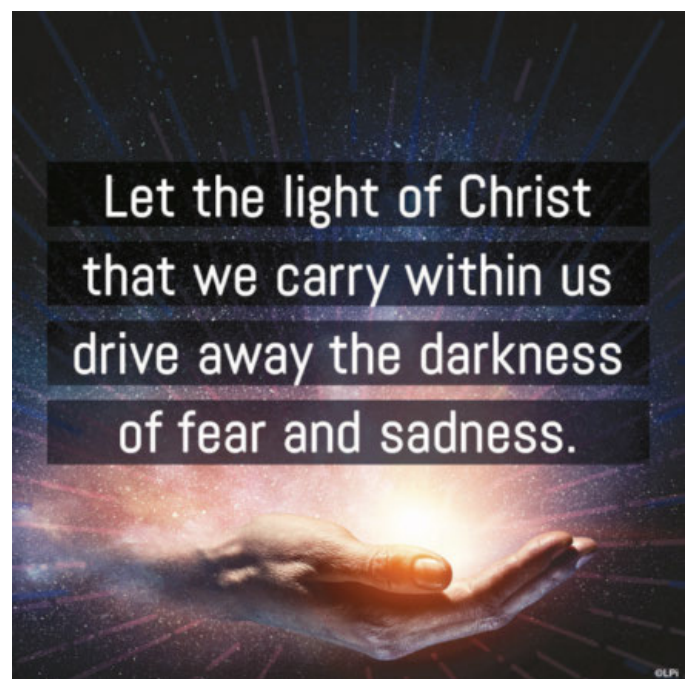
When I came to you, brothers and sisters,

Fifth Week of Ordinary Time

On the **Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time**, Jesus encourages his disciples to let their light shine: “Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father.”

Monday is the **Memorial of Paul Miki and Companions**. Friday is the **Memorial of Saint Scholastica, virgin**.

For the next two weeks, our first reading on the weekdays will be from the **Book of Genesis**. This week begins with the stirring story of creation, one that will be repeated at the Easter Vigil.

Mark's Gospel continues with stories of Jesus' healing and of his challenging and being challenged by the religious authorities. “People immediately recognized him. They scurried about the surrounding country and began to bring in the sick on mats.” The Pharisees and scribes question Jesus asking, “Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?” A frustrated Jesus responds, “You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition.” Jesus challenges the people to disregard rules about being defiled by food but to avoid the evil desires and deeds that defile their hearts. Traveling north into pagan territory, Jesus visits a woman whose daughter has an unclean spirit. Jesus heals her because the mother believes in him. On his way back, Jesus heals a man, allowing him to hear and speak again. Jesus feeds 4,000 people for whom he is moved with pity.

On the **Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time** we hear **Matthew's Gospel**. Jesus speaks to his followers about religious laws and also of our own relationships. Go to offer gifts to God at the altar, but first, Jesus says, “Leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift.”

Daily Prayer This Week

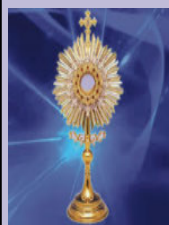
Every week we are trying to find intimacy with our Lord in the midst of our everyday lives. We use the stories about Jesus in the readings of the week to help us. Because our days are so busy, those stories make connections among what we are experiencing, God's Word to us and the desires that are coming to the surface in us.

This week we can let various parts of this week's rich scripture readings touch us, depending on what is going on in us. It all begins with our beginning the day, establishing a connection. With the briefest of rising prayers, we can talk with our Lord about what we anticipate needing that day.

One day I might know that, with what I have to face that day, I need to ask that the healing Jesus be with me. I might be able to name what needs healing. “Lord, you know the fear that is developing in me as I face this meeting today.” “Lord, take this anger away from my heart.” “Most loving Lord, have mercy on me and heal this pattern that plagues me and takes away my happiness, my freedom, my ability to love.” On another day, I may know that I'm right in the middle of the struggle over my disregarding what God really wants me to do, using legalistic excuses to avoid God's will. I might beg, “Lord, I've become such a hypocrite. Purify my heart so I can see as you see, judge as you judge and love as you love. Help me be truly religious, truly compassionate, truly your disciple today.”

On other days, I might be in a “foreign” territory, or at least one that seems quite a distance from believing territory. I might ask, “Dear Lord, keep me safe here. Give me courage here. Help me find intimacy with you here. And let me see the faith of so many of your people here.”

Some day this week, let's imagine how Jesus has pity on our hunger and feeds us. And every night this week, let's express our gratitude for receiving what we asked for in faith, from the One who is waiting to give us what we need.

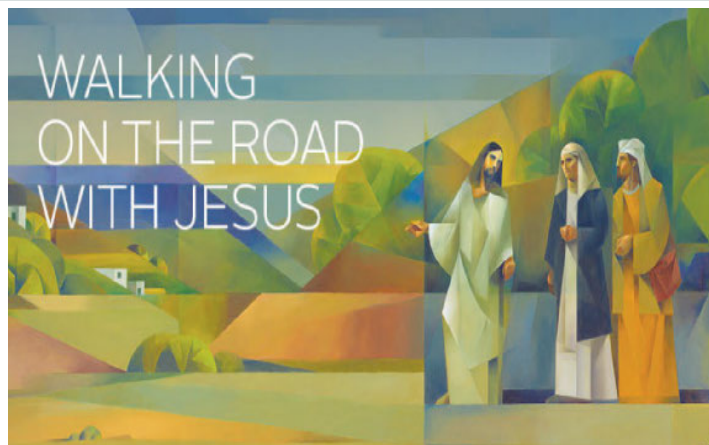
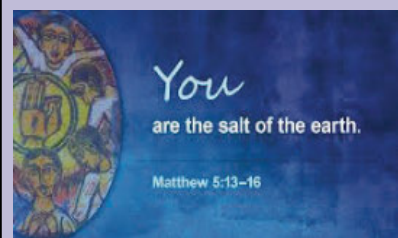


ADORATION of the BLESSED SACRAMENT

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC

If ...

It's a surprising little word — if. For such a short word, it holds an abundance of excuses.

Personally, I could buy a new car if I had a dollar for every time I used the word “if” to explain away my own flaws. “If I wasn’t so tired. If we had more money. If the kids weren’t always on my last nerve. If I had more talent. If life wasn’t so hard.”

If, if, if.

I don’t always feel like being the salt of the earth. Can’t someone else season the dish? Sometimes it’s more than I want to give, more than I want to do, more than I want to be. Sharing my bread, sheltering the oppressed, clothing the naked, and accompanying my neighbor — doing these things in the literal or figurative sense can be completely exhausting. Mediocrity is so easy. It’s so comfortable. But *if*. It looms again, that short but powerful word.

“If” can be deep with excuses, but it can also be wide with possibility. If I bring it all to God. If I stop relying on my own abilities. If I prayed more than I talked. If I make my heart firm. If my faith does not rest on human wisdom.

If not me, who? If not now, when?

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

What is the “Miraculous Medal” and why is it called that?

Answer:

The medal of the Immaculate Conception that has come to be called simply the “Miraculous Medal” dates back to an apparition of Mary to Saint Catherine Laboure, who was then a novice sister with the Daughters of Charity. On November 27, 1830, Our Lady appeared to her standing on a globe, with shafts of light streaming from her hands and the words, “O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee,” surrounding the image. In the same vision, Catherine saw a capital “M” with a cross above it and below two hearts. Catherine seemed to hear a voice telling her to have what she saw struck as a medal and a promise that those who wore the medal would have the protection and intercession of the Mother of God. The first 1,500 of medals were distributed in 1832. Many miraculous favors were attributed to the use of the medal.

Saint Catherine’s “Miraculous Medal” is among the recognizable and popular symbols of modern Catholicism. Reflecting on its widespread use, the 2001 Vatican document, “Directory on Popular Piety and Liturgy,” observes that the medal “recalls the mystery of Redemption, the love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and of the Sorrowful Heart of Mary. It signifies the mediatory role of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the mystery of the Church, the relationship between Heaven and earth, this life and eternal life.”
