From the Pastor

The Pope's First Sermon

His circumstances were unusual. To Jerusalem, at Pentecost, one of the two largest Jewish holidays, thousands of pilgrims came from all over the world. Phrygia, Pamphylia, Egypt, Libya - these are just a few of the lands mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles.

Of course, they did not come to hear St. Peter, because on that day they remembered the covenant that God made with Noah, and then with Moses, handing him the Torah, and they wanted to enjoy the harvest of wheat. But when Peter began to speak, and to speak to them, a kind of general audience took place. It was the first sermon because the Holy Spirit just recently descended on those gathered in the Upper Room. He gave those who just before were full of prayer but also afraid, courage and power. It was in this power that "Peter stood with the Eleven and spoke in a loud voice."

And what was the first sermon about? It was about Jesus Christ, which is obvious and understandable: Jesus Nazarene, delivered, nailed to the cross and killed, was raised up from the dead because it was impossible for him to be overwhelmed by death. But there was something very important in this sermon to the Jews. Saint Peter shows his listeners that the Resurrection should not have been a surprise to them, because one of the psalms had already proclaimed it: "You will not abandon me to the realm of the dead, you will not let your holy one see decay."

In the context of the Old Testament message, Jesus Christ is not something like a surprise witcher child. On the contrary. He is the realization and fulfillment of the prophecies that spoke about His birth and about His public activity as well as about His saving passion and glorious resurrection. It is an undeniable fact that only Jesus Christ among the founders of great religions does not appear out of nowhere. He is even expected. To fully understand the meaning of his mission, one must study it in the context of the Old Testament books. Forgetting about this carries the risk of warping and distorting. The Pontifical Biblical Commission teaches, and even warns in this regard, that Jesus Christ without the Old Testament is like a meteor coming accidentally and not known from where.

Słowo Proboszcza

Pierwsze kazanie papieża

Jego okoliczności były niezwykle. Oto do Jerozolimy na dzień Pięćdziesiątnicy, jedno z dwóch największych świąt żydowskich, tysiącami przybywali pątnicy ze wszystkich stron świata. Frygia, Pamfilia, Egipt, Libia – to tylko kilka z krain, które wymienia autor Dziejów Apostolskich.

Nie przybyli oczywiście, by słuchać św. Piotra, bo w tym dniu wspominali przymierze, jakie Bóg zawarł z Noem, a potem z Mojżeszem, przekazując mu Torę, i cieszyli się zbiorami pszenicy. Ale gdy Piotr zaczął przemawiać, i to przemawiać właśnie do nich, odbyła się swoista audyencja generalna. Była pierwsza, bo dopiero co na zebranych w Wieczerniku zstąpił Duch Święty. To On dał tym, jeszcze przed chwilą rozmodlonym, ale i załęknionym odwagę i moc. To w tej mocy „stał Piotr razem z Jedenastoma i przemówił donośnym głosem”.

A o czym było to pierwsze kazanie? Że o Jezusie Chrystusie, to oczywiste i zrozumiałe: Jezus Nazarejczyk, wydany, przybity do krzyża i zabity, został wskrzeszony, bo było niemożliwe, aby nad Nim panowała śmierć. Ale w tym kazaniu, głoszonym do Żydów, było też coś bardzo ważnego. Święty Piotr pokazuje słuchaczom, że Zmartwychwstanie nie powinno być dla nich zaskoczeniem, bo wieścił je już jeden z psalmów: „Nie zostawisz duszy mojej w Otchłani ani nie dasz Świętemu Twemu ulec skażeniu”.

W kontekście orędzia Starego Testamentu Jezus Chrystus nie jest kimś na kształt wiedźminowego dziecka niespodzianki. Wręcz przeciwnie. On jest spełnieniem i wypełnieniem prorocत्व, które mówiły i o Jego narodzinach, i o publicznej działalności oraz o zbawczej męce i chwalebnym zmartwychwstaniu. Jest niezaprzeczalnym faktem, że tylko Jezus Chrystus wśród założycieli wielkich religii nie pojawia się znikąd. Wręcz jest oczekiwany. By w pełni zrozumieć sens Jego posłannictwa, trzeba je studiować w kontekście ksiąg Starego Testamentu. Zapominanie o tym niesie ryzyko wypaczenia i przekłamania. Papieska Komisja Biblijna uczy, a wręcz ostrzega w tym względzie, że Jezus Chrystus bez Starego Testamentu jest niczym meteor przybywający przypadkowo i nie wiadomo skąd.

SUNDAY READINGS

Reading 1 - Acts of the Apostles: 2:14, 22-33

Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and proclaimed:

"You who are Jews, indeed all of you staying in Jerusalem. Let this be known to you, and listen to my words.

You who are Israelites, hear these words.

Jesus the Nazarene was a man commended to you by God with mighty deeds, wonders, and signs, which God worked through him in your midst, as you yourselves know.

This man, delivered up by the set plan and foreknowledge of God, you killed, using lawless men to crucify him.

But God raised him up, releasing him from the throes of death, because it was impossible for him to be held by it.

For David says of him:

I saw the Lord ever before me, with him at my right hand I shall not be disturbed.

Therefore my heart has been glad and my tongue has exulted; my flesh, too, will dwell in hope, because you will not abandon my soul to the netherworld, nor will you suffer your holy one to see corruption.

You have made known to me the paths of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence.

"My brothers, one can confidently say to you about the patriarch David that he died and was buried, and his tomb is in our midst to this day.

But since he was a prophet and knew that God had sworn an oath to him that he would set one of his descendants upon his throne, he foresaw and spoke of the resurrection of the Christ, that neither was he abandoned to the netherworld nor did his flesh see corruption.

God raised this Jesus; of this we are all witnesses.

Exalted at the right hand of God, he received the promise of the Holy Spirit from the Father and poured him forth, as you see and hear."

Reading 2 - 1 Peter 1:17-21

Beloved:

If you invoke as Father him who judges impartially according to each one's works, conduct yourselves with reverence during the time of your sojourning, realizing that you were ransomed from your futile conduct, handed on by your ancestors, not with perishable things like silver or gold but with the precious blood of Christ as of a spotless unblemished lamb.

He was known before the foundation of the world but revealed in the final time for you, who through him believe in God who raised him from the dead and gave him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God.

Gospel: Luke 24:13-35

That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred.

And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him.

He asked them, "What are you discussing as you walk along?" They stopped, looking downcast.

One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply,

"Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?"

And he replied to them, "What sort of things?"

They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him. But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this, it is now the third day since this took place.

Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive.

Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described, but him they did not see."

And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are!

How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke!

Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?"

Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures.

As they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going on farther.

But they urged him, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over."

So he went in to stay with them.

And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight.

Then they said to each other,

"Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?"

So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together

the eleven and those with them who were saying,

"The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!"

Then the two recounted

what had taken place on the way

and how he was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

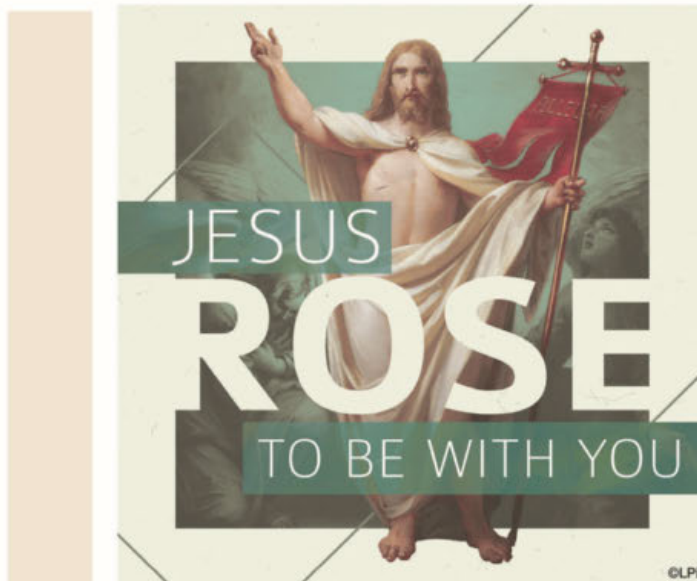

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Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I always feel a little sad when someone begins to speak to me with the words, "Father, I know you're so busy, but ..." It happens a lot. And I get it. He or she is trying to be respectful of my time. But it saddens me because a priest makes Jesus present to people in a special way, and Jesus *always* has time for us. Don't we all feel at times that God just doesn't have time for us?

Nonsense. Just look at the stunning "Road to Emmaus" story we hear this week. It's the day Jesus rose from the dead. And the Risen One appears in disguise to two disciples. He walks with them, chats with them, and eventually eats with them. It could have been hours he spends with them — two unnamed persons — in the middle of nowhere. On the day he rose from the dead!

My friends, please take this to heart: The Risen Jesus is not too busy to spend time with you! He doesn't have "better things to do." You and I are members of this crucified and risen Body. He therefore has all the time in the world to be with us. So, I challenge you this week to approach him confidently in prayer and conversation. After all, being with you and me is the reason he rose from the dead.

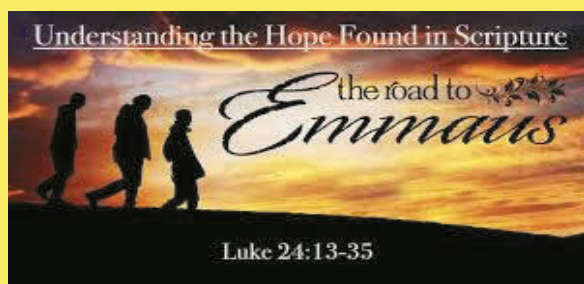

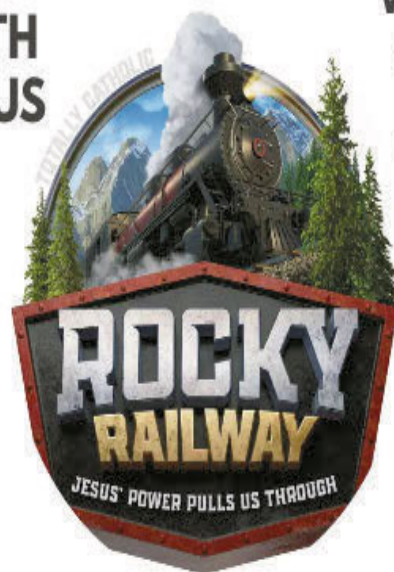

Oto dwaj uczniowie Jezusa tego samego dnia, w pierwszy dzień tygodnia, byli w drodze do wsi, zwanej Emaus, oddalonej sześćdziesiąt stadiów od Jerozolimy. Rozmawiali oni ze sobą o tym wszystkim, co się wydarzyło. Gdy tak rozmawiali i rozprawiali ze sobą, sam Jezus przybliżył się i siedł z nimi. Lecz czy ich były niejako na uwięzi, tak że Go nie poznali. On zaś ich zapytał: „Cóż to za rozmowy prowadzicie ze sobą w drodze?”. Zatrzymali się smutni. A jeden z nich, imieniem Kleofas, odpowiedział Mu: „Ty jesteś chyba jedynym z przebywających w Jerozolimie, który nie wie, co się tam w tych dniach stało”.

Zapytał ich: „Cóż takiego?”.

Poszli niektórzy z naszych do grobu i zastali wszystko tak, jak kobiety opowiadały, ale Jego nie widzieli”.

Na to On rzekł do nich: „O, nierozumni, jak nieskore są wasze serca do wierzenia we wszystko, co powiedzieli prorocy! Czyż Mesjasz nie miał tego cierpieć, aby wejść do swojej chwały?”. I zaczynając od Mojżesza poprzez wszystkich proroków wykladał im, co we wszystkich Pismach odnosiło się do Niego. Tak przybliżyli się do wsi, do której zdążali, a On okazywał, jakoby miał iść dalej. Lecz przymusili Go, mówiąc: „Zostań z nami, gdyż ma się ku wieczorowi i dzień się już nacylił”. Wszedł więc, aby zostać z nimi. Gdy zajął z nimi miejsce u stołu, wziął chleb, odmówił błogosławieństwo, połamał go i dawał im, Wtedy otworzyły się im oczy i poznali Go, lecz On zniknął im z oczu. I mówili nawzajem do siebie: „Czy serce nie pałało w nas, kiedy rozmawiał z nami w drodze i Pisma nam wyjaśniał?”.
