From the Pastor

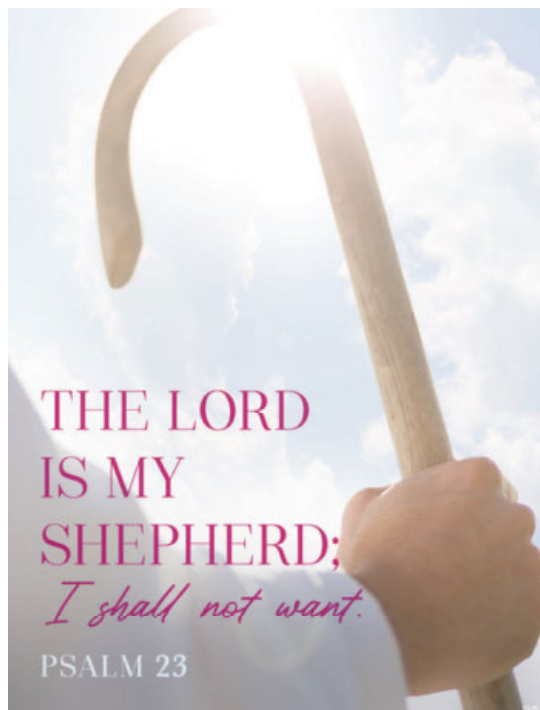
Trouble with Conversion

In the Acts of the Apostles, the first sermon of the Church given by St. Peter on the day of Pentecost makes a return. The listeners – were there by accident, because they came to Jerusalem for the Jewish holiday of Pentecost – but "they took it to heart."

And the result of this anxiety of the spirit was the question, "What shall we do?" And here for the first time in the Acts of the Apostles the call is made: "Repent!" The interesting thing here is that the oldest message from the Gospel, the one written by St. Mark, the same appeal began the public teaching of Jesus Christ: "The time has come and the kingdom of God is near. Repent and believe in the Gospel!" This first call is a program, axis, center and reference point.

Conversion begins with a change in mindset. In the circle of religious experience it is very

important, because it reminds that faith - as some would like - is not just a feeling. Faith is an act that surrounds the whole person. Even if it remains a sphere of mystery (without it it would be pure knowledge, not faith), it still requires rational justifications and arguments. The answer pertaining to will is then built on top of them. Did such a process accompany the hearts of the listeners of St. Peter? This seems to be confirmed by theology, equally and dynamically built together with the faith of the original Church.



Słowo Proboszcza

Kłopot z nawróceniem

W lekturze Dziejów Apostolskich wraca pierwsza katecheza Kościoła wygłoszona przez św. Piotra w dniu zesłania Ducha Świętego. Słuchacze – przypadkowi, bo przecież przybyli do Jerozolimy na żydowskie święto Pięćdziesiątnicy – „przejęli się do głębi serca”.

A skutkiem tego niepokoju ducha było pytanie: „Co mamy czynić?”. I tu po raz pierwszy w Dziejach Apostolskich pada wezwanie: „Nawróćcie się!”. Ciekawa rzecz, że w przekazie najstarszej z Ewangelii, a więc tej napisanej przez św. Marka, ten sam apel rozpoczyna publiczne nauczanie Jezusa Chrystusa: „Czas się wypełnił i bliskie jest królestwo Boże. Nawracajcie się i wierzcie w Ewangelię!”. Pierwsze wezwanie to poniekąd program, oś, centrum i punkt odniesienia.

Nawrócenie rozpoczyna się od zmiany sposobu myślenia. W kręgu przeżyć religijnych jest to bardzo ważne, bo przypomina, że wiara – jak chcieliby niektórzy – nie jest jedynie uczuciem. Wiara jest aktem, który obejmuje całego człowieka. Nawet jeśli pozostaje sferą tajemnicy (bez niej byłaby czystą wiedzą, a nie wiarą), to przecież domaga się rozumowych uzasadnień i argumentów. Na nich buduje odpowiedź wola. Czy taki proces towarzyszył sercom słuchaczy św. Piotra? Zdaje się to potwierdzać teologia, jednakowo dynamicznie budująca się razem z wiarą pierwotnego Kościoła.

SUNDAY READINGS

Reading 1 - Acts of the Apostles: 2:14a, 36-41

Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and proclaimed:
 "Let the whole house of Israel know for certain that God has made both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified."

Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart,
 and they asked Peter and the other apostles,
 "What are we to do, my brothers?"
 Peter said to them,
 "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins;
 and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is made to you and to your children and to all those far off, whomever the Lord our God will call."
 He testified with many other arguments, and was exhorting them,
 "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand persons were added that day.

Reading 2 - 1 Peter 2:20b-25

Beloved:
 If you are patient when you suffer for doing what is good,
 this is a grace before God.
 For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example that you should follow in his footsteps.
He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth.

When he was insulted, he returned no insult;
 when he suffered, he did not threaten;
 instead, he handed himself over to the one who judges justly.
 He himself bore our sins in his body upon the cross, so that, free from sin, we might live for righteousness.
 By his wounds you have been healed.
 For you had gone astray like sheep,

but you have now returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

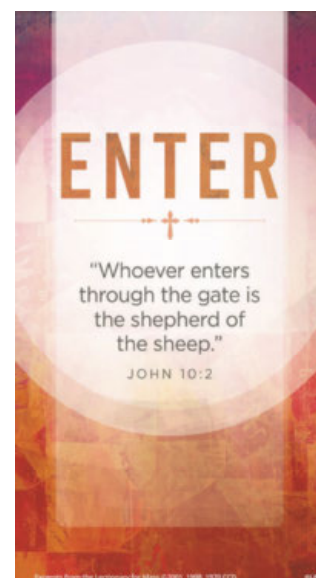

 But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers."
 Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them.

So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them.
 I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture.
 A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I recently rescued a dog. She's a terrier and rather adorable. And she's crazy about me. She could spend all day with me. But I'm a pastor at a parish and sometimes I leave her at the front desk of the church office. She constantly amazes me by her ability to distinguish between my voice and that of everyone else. If I say one word, even if I'm hidden around a corner, she'll sprint toward me and jump up into my arms.

This week the readings focus our attention to the voice of the risen Jesus Christ. Comparing his disciples to sheep and himself to a shepherd, he says, **"They recognize his voice."** He speaks to us and wants us to respond. When we hear his voice, we follow. Throughout this coming week, we will experience many interior promptings to receive God's love, and to love Him in return. That's his voice. Follow it into the safe and tender arms of Christ.

By contrast, some voices we will hear do not convey God's concern and love for us, but rather produce fear, despair, and other harmful mischief. Jesus calls these voices those of robbers. Does an idea or thought make it harder for you to love God? If so, run away. Let it go. It is most likely not the voice of the Risen Lord. Keep waiting for him to speak. You will recognize his voice. Then run to him as fast as you can.

Why Should I Become a Member of St. Fabian Parish?

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. Membership requires signing up and formally enrolling yourself in the parish. But it is also more than just filling out some forms. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of a parish.

Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a parish, what benefits and obligations the community has to the archdiocese, and how many Masses and programs are planned and scheduled.

Registration not only shows you belong, but may be necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, participating in religious education programs and getting donation statements for tax purposes. At times young adults who have moved away for years think they are still registered under their parents. Or sometimes previously registered parishioners join another parish, or are inactive for a long period of time, but assume they are still registered here. When they want to come back to receive a sacrament, such as baptism or marriage, or perhaps enroll a child in the religious education program, they find that they are no longer registered here and must begin the process over.

Committing to a parish is much like a commitment to a family, sports team, and school or community organization. Just like you want the parish to be there to provide Masses, Sacraments, education programs and ministries, the parish needs to be able to count on you to help and assist in their mission; to be an active member.

Are you registered with us? One way to know is if you receive offertory envelopes. If you do not receive these, then perhaps you are not registered here, or have been listed as “inactive” due to inactivity. You may want to check with the parish office staff.

Registering in the parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of our parish. As parish members, we are all here to help each other on our spiritual journey; we don’t want to do this alone. As much as you need us, we need you too. You may come to the parish office or see an usher or greeter at the Mass you attend.
