From the Pastor

A Jar Full of Good Results

Quantity does not want to change into quality. This rule, present in every community, also touched the first community of Christ's disciples. "As the number of students increased," neglect of the Hellenist widows arose.

And in this dimension, the Acts of the Apostles are astounding and surprising. On the one hand, they show the life of the first community in almost idyllic colors: the community of goods, respect for the environment, mutual love, but on the other hand, it grinds on something. The truth of an ideal collides with the truth of everyday life. And it is in this that the Acts breathes honesty. The struggle for holiness clashes with that which is human. The punished lie of Ananias and Safira stands next to the readiness to suffer for Christ, because "one has to listen to God more than people" - as Peter and the apostles said before the Sanhedrin.

The fragment of the Book read today not only reminds us the story of the choice of the "seven men, enjoying good fame, full of spirit and wisdom," but speaks a lot about the Jerusalem community. It was not a homogeneous organism. It was made up of Hebrews and Hellenists. Both were Jews who believed in Christ. Except that the Hebrews were Jews from Palestine. They spoke Aramaic and were far from opening up to the world of Hellenistic culture. Hellenists, on the other hand, were Jews who, although they lived in Palestine, were newcomers here. They spoke Greek and somehow remained under the influence of the Hellenistic world. It was the latter who were open to non-Jews and ready to give them a message about Christ.

It was from the Hellenists that these men were chosen to serve the tables fairly. Their names, which were all Greek, testify to this. But the book's further narrative shows that this group - later called deacons - also devoted itself to the ministry of the word. The wisdom of Stephen's teaching could not be met by his opponents. Stoned, he became the first martyr of the Church. And the Hellenists chased from Jerusalem began to preach the Gospel outside of Judea. Philip taught in Samaria. Peter and John visited the fruits of his work. And the Jerusalem Hellenists from Cyprus and Cyrene strengthened the communities of Christ's disciples in Antioch. And so this grinding became a happy fault that the history of Christ's Church knows much of.

Słowo Proboszcza

Zgrzyt pełen dobrych skutków

Ilość nie chce przechodzić w jakość. To prawidło, obecne w każdej społeczności, dotknęło także pierwszej wspólnoty uczniów Chrystusa. „Gdy liczba uczniów wzrastała”, pojawiło się zaniedbanie wdów hellenistów.

I w tym wymiarze Dzieje Apostolskie zdumiewają i zaskakują. Z jednej strony ukazują życie pierwszej wspólnoty we wręcz idyllicznych barwach: wspólnota dóbr, szacunek otoczenia, wzajemna miłość, a z drugiej co raz to coś zgrzyta. Prawda ideału zderza się z prawdą codzienności. I właśnie w tym Dzieje Apostolskie tchną szczerością. Zmaganie o świętość ściera się z tym, co ludzkie. Ukaranie kłamstwo Ananiasza i Safiry staje obok gotowości ponoszenia cierpień dla Chrystusa, bo „bardziej trzeba słuchać Boga niż ludzi” – jak przed sanhedrynem mówili Piotr i apostołowie.

Czytany dziś fragment Księgi nie tylko przypomina historię wyboru „siedmiu mężów, cieszących się dobrą sławą, pełnych Ducha i mądrości”, ale mówi bardzo dużo o jerozolimskiej wspólnocie. Nie była ona jednolitym organizmem. Tworzyli ją Hebrajczycy i helleniści. I jedni, i drudzy byli Żydami, którzy uwierzyli Chrystusowi. Z tym, że Hebrajczycy byli Żydami pochodzącymi z Palestyny. Mówili po aramejsku i dalecy byli od otwierania się na świat kultury hellenistycznej. Helleniści natomiast byli Żydami, którzy – choć mieszkali w Palestynie – byli tu przybyszami. Mówili po grecku i jakoś pozostawali pod wpływem świata hellenistycznego. To ci ostatni byli otwarci na nie-Żydów i gotowi nieść im orędzie o Chrystusie.

To z hellenistów zostali wybrani owi mężowie do sprawiedliwego obsługiwania stołów. Świadczą o tym ich imiona, wszystkie greckie. Ale dalsza narracja Księgi pokazuje, że ta grupa – nazwana później diakonami – poświęciła się też posłudze słowa. Mądrości nauczającego Szczepana nie mogli sprostać jego przeciwnicy. Ukamienowany, stał się pierwszym męczennikiem Kościoła. A przegonieni z Jerozolimy helleniści zaczęli głosić Ewangelię poza Judeą. Filip nauczał w Samarii. Owoce jego pracy wizytowali Piotr i Jan. A jerozolimscy helleniści pochodzący z Cypru i Cyreny umacniali wspólnoty uczniów Chrystusa w Antiochii. I tak to ów zgrzyt stał się szczęśliwą winą, jakich bez liku znają dzieje Chrystusowego Kościoła.

SUNDAY READINGS

Reading 1 - Acts of the Apostles: 6:1-7

As the number of disciples continued to grow, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. So the Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." The proposal was acceptable to the whole community, so they chose Stephen, a man filled with faith and the Holy Spirit, also Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicholas of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid hands on them. The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly; even a large group of priests were becoming obedient to the faith.

Reading 2 - 1 Peter 2:4-9

Beloved:
Come to him, a living stone, rejected by human beings but chosen and precious in the sight of God, and, like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it says in Scripture:
Behold, I am laying a stone in Zion, a cornerstone, chosen and precious, and whoever believes in it shall not be put to shame. Therefore, its value is for you who have faith, but for those without faith:
The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone, and A stone that will make people stumble, and a rock that will make them fall. They stumble by disobeying the word, as is their destiny.

You are "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own,

so that you may announce the praises" of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.

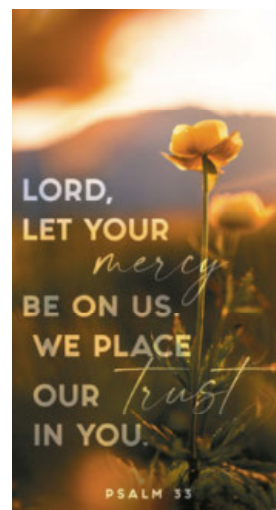

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

If you had to summarize the essential core of the Christian life, what would it be? Mercy, truth, or love, perhaps? The readings today suggest another word which may surprise you. That word is *priesthood*.

St. Peter says to us, "You are a 'chosen race, a royal priesthood...'" To be part of a priesthood is to offer a particular sacrifice in order for the community to survive and thrive. Jesus is the great high priest because he offers the one perfect sacrifice which heals and perfects the entire human race. Peter the Apostle wants us to know that all the baptized share in this priestly ministry. The whole of our lives, including every detail, is meant to become our acceptable offering to God.

The baptized exercise this priesthood in many ways, I'll mention three. At Sunday Mass, in private prayer, and in daily work. At Mass, we offer the sacrifice of our lives with that of the priest, who symbolizes Christ the Priest. In our prayer, a "morning offering" prayer is a great way to offer up all the joys and sufferings of the day to come. In our daily work, we sacrifice our time, comfort, money, and energy to do good for others. All this gives the deepest possible meaning to our lives: we share in the priesthood which saves the world. That's at the core of our faith.
