From the Pastor

Is He with Us or Not?

We read in the Acts of the Apostles: "He rose up in their presence and the cloud took him out of their sight." And in the Gospel of St. Matthew, we hear Jesus' assurance: "And here I am with you all the days until the end of the world." So how is it? He ascended to heaven, is He still with us? You can't stay in two places at once.

We are slaves to spatial imagination. You need to run your heart's imagination. Yes, something can't be in two places at once, but a person, all of a sudden, can. How? We need to notice the difference between personal and material presence. We put the washing machine or fridge in one place. The thing takes up some space and it's just there. What about a person? Someone may physically sit in a church pew, but internally be somewhere else. How many times do we feel that someone is physically next to us but far away in spirit. And vice versa, you can be physically far away from someone, but stay close internally. We often say to someone, "You are in my heart." "No, this is not an empty, sentimental phrase. Personal presence takes place where there is a real meeting; where there is a bond between people. We are in the hearts of those who love us. We carry those we love in our hearts. Personal presence is stronger, greater than space and time. Personal presence also has this characteristic that it can be more or less. You can talk about a certain intensity of presence, its quality. There is nothing more to a fridge or washing machine. A person can be more or less.

Jesus as a human could only be physically in a specific place, space, and time. Ascension means the definitive end to His mission on Earth. We no longer have the chance to see Him and listen to Him as the Apostles did. The "I am with you" promise is about a personal presence, not a physical presence. It is a spiritual and internal presence. The promise of presence accompanies the missionary command: "Go and teach ... by baptizing." Jesus commands his disciples to maintain their presence in the church. This is done through the Word, through the sacraments, through the community. New people still carry Jesus' presence in their hearts. Jesus carries new people in his heart.

Christ ascended to heaven not only as God but also as a man. In this sense, the Ascension shows that God is the proper "place" for people. The fate of Jesus is a preview of our fate. Ascension shows the true direction of human development: the intensification of God's presence in us, up to its highest "density," which is heaven. Because Heaven is not something, but SOMEONE. Heaven, meaning God, matures in us. Ascension is not about space, but about the real dimensions of humanity.

Słowo Proboszcza

Jest z nami czy nie?

Czytamy w Dziejach Apostolskich: „Uniósł się w ich obecności w górę i obłok zabrał Go im sprzed oczu”. A w Ewangelii św. Mateusza słyszymy zapewnienie Jezusa: „A oto Ja jestem z wami przez wszystkie dni, aż do skończenia świata”. To jak to w końcu jest? Wstąpił do nieba, czy nadal z nami jest? Nie można przecież przebywać w dwóch miejscach naraz.

Jesteśmy niewolnikami wyobraźni przestrzennej. Trzeba uruchomić wyobraźnię serca. Owszem, rzecz nie może być w dwóch miejscach naraz, ale człowiek może. W jaki sposób? Trzeba zauważyć różnicę między obecnością osobową i rzeczową. Pralkę czy lodówkę stawiamy w jednym miejscu i cześć. Rzecz zajmuje jakąś przestrzeń i tam po prostu jest. A osoba? Ktoś może fizycznie siedzieć w kościelnej ławce, ale wewnątrz być zupełnie gdzie indziej. Ileż to razy mamy poczucie, że ktoś fizycznie jest obok nas, ale duchem daleko. I odwrotnie, można być fizycznie daleko od kogoś, ale wewnątrz pozostawać blisko. Mówimy nieraz do kogoś: „jesteś w moim sercu”. Nie, to nie jest pusty, sentymentalny zwrot. Obecność osobowa ma miejsce tam, gdzie dochodzi do autentycznego spotkania; tam, gdzie powstaje więź między osobami. Jestem w sercach tych, którzy mnie kochają. Noszę w sercu tych, których kocham. Obecność osobowa jest silniejsza, większa niż przestrzeń i czas.

Obecność osobowa ma jeszcze i to do siebie, że można być bardziej lub mniej. Można mówić o pewnej intensywności obecności, o jej jakości. Lodówka czy pralka nie może więcej być. Osoba może być bardziej lub mniej.

Jezus jako człowiek mógł fizycznie być tylko w określonym miejscu przestrzeni, czasu. Wniebowstąpienie oznacza definitywne zakończenie ziemskiej misji. Nie mamy już szans oglądać Go i słuchać tak jak Apostołowie. Obietnica „Jestem z wami” dotyczy obecności osobowej, a nie rzeczowej. To obecność duchowa, wewnętrzna. Obietnica obecności towarzyszy nakazowi misyjnemu: „Idźcie i nauczajcie... udzielając chrztu”. Jezus nakazuje uczniom podtrzymywanie swojej obecności w Kościele. To się dokonuje przez Słowo, przez sakramenty, przez wspólnotę. Ciągłe nowi ludzie noszą w sercu Jezusową obecność. Jezus nosi w swoim sercu nowych ludzi.

Chrystus wstąpił do nieba nie tylko jako Bóg, ale i jako człowiek. W tym sensie Wniebowstąpienie pokazuje, że właściwym „miejscem” człowieka jest sam Bóg. Los Jezusa jest zapowiedzią naszego losu. Wniebowstąpienie pokazuje prawdziwy kierunek ludzkiego rozwoju: intensyfikacja Bożej obecności w nas, aż po jej najwyższą „gęstość”, czyli niebo. Bo niebo to nie coś, ale KTOŚ. Niebo, czyli Bóg dojrzeć w nas. We Wniebowstąpieniu nie chodzi o przestrzeń kosmiczną, ale o prawdziwe wymiary człowieczeństwa.

SUNDAY READINGS

Reading 1: Acts of the Apostles: 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus,
I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught
until the day he was taken up,
after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit
to the apostles whom he had chosen.
He presented himself alive to them
by many proofs after he had suffered,
appearing to them during forty days
and speaking about the kingdom of God.
While meeting with the them,
he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem,
but to wait for “the promise of the Father
about which you have heard me speak;
for John baptized with water,
but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.”

When they had gathered together they asked him,
“Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?”

He answered them, “It is not for you to know the times or seasons
that the Father has established by his own authority.
But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you,
and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem,
throughout Judea and Samaria,
and to the ends of the earth.”

When he had said this, as they were looking on,
he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight.

While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going,
suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them.

They said, “Men of Galilee,
why are you standing there looking at the sky?
This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven
will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.”

teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.

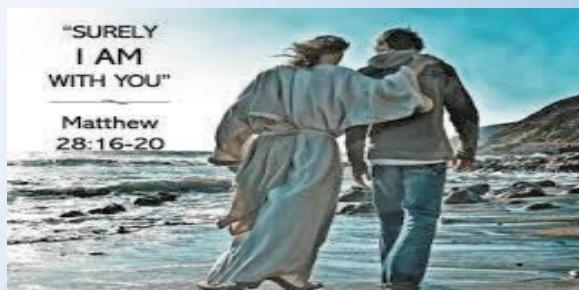

ADORATION of the BLESSED SACRAMENT

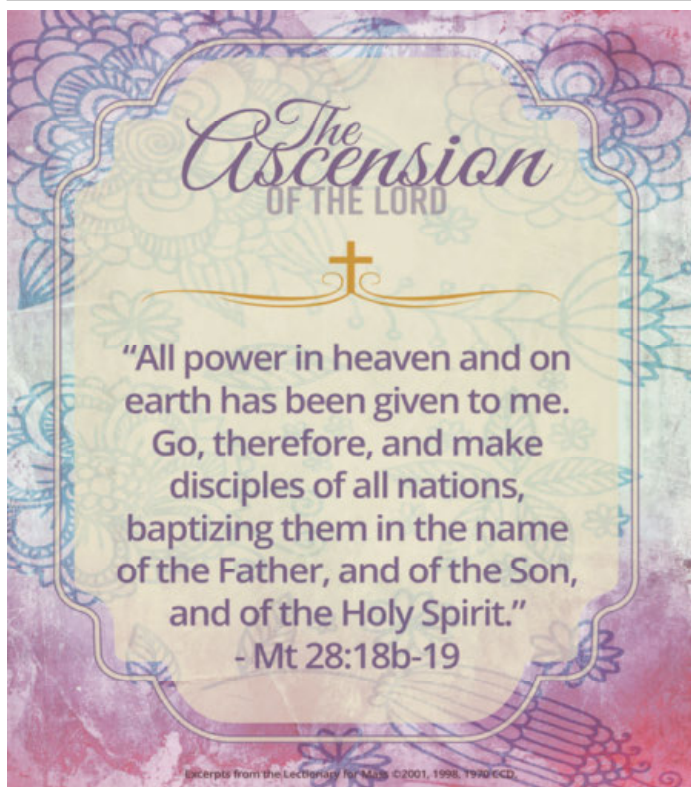

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Traditionally, the four writers of the Gospels are symbolized by four creatures that make their way into Church art and architecture: Matthew, an angel; Mark, a lion; Luke, an ox; and John, an eagle. These images can be found in churches across the world, a nod to those who recorded the stories of Jesus for us, thousands of years ago.

Today's Gospel was written by John. There are a few reasons why John is symbolized by an eagle, but my favorite explanation is that his writings soar like an eagle into the sky with their beautiful, poetic language. The prayer we hear today is no different — Jesus invokes God in a long discourse that might seem mystifying at times, the same way that a poem can be perplexing to understand when we are unfamiliar with the pacing or format.

Consider holding onto the shortest sentence in this prayer: "I pray for them."

Jesus prays for us. For me. For you.

Let that sink deep into your being.

Jesus is on your side. He is aware of what you are holding at this moment. He is aware of your pain, your faith, your mission. And He's rooting for you. This prayer was recorded thousands of years ago, far before you were born. Since before you were born, you were held in prayer. With that certainty, we live.

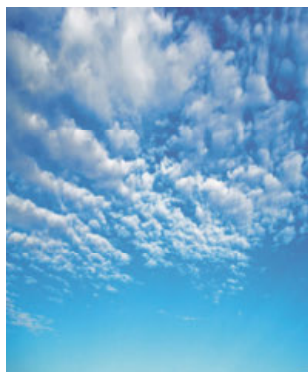

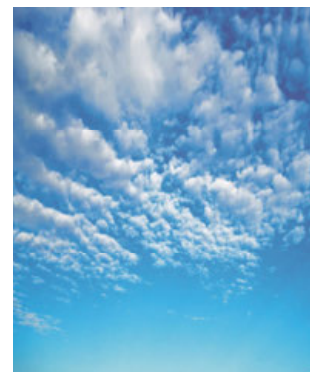

Początek Dziejów Apostolskich

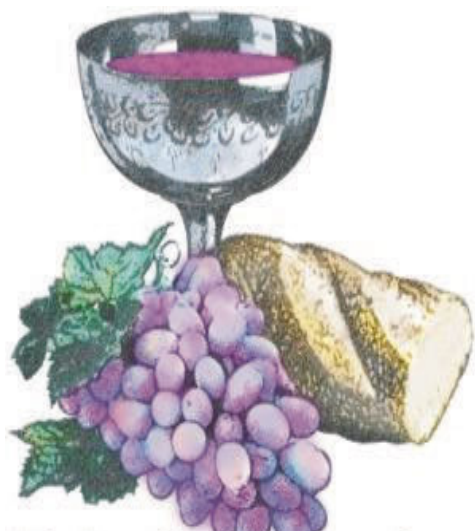
