From the Pastor

Care For the Soul

Nowadays, the value of material goods is overestimated. Many people cannot forgive themselves, for example, a car collision, because it has almost become an object of worship for them. Others get angry when a child accidentally breaks some expensive glass or when something breaks. We fall victim to things or situations too easily. An unsuccessful exam can cause suicidal thoughts in young people. And yet these are not all the sources of problems: many people put their body second after material things. What does one not do to improve their appearance?

Body care and caring about one's health are the right things to do, but how much is this exaggerated today? Let's look at this in the context of today's Gospel. What does Jesus mean by saying "Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul." The Lord Jesus wants us to understand how much God cares for everyone and how great human dignity is. Our task is to find the right hierarchy of values, value the spiritual element of our lives.

In many psalms we find beautiful stanzas praising God the Supreme as an escape, a refuge, defense and consolation for people, and today's Gospel makes us reflect on what is really important in our human existence. These are wonderful words. It results from them, how gentle and caring God treats us - the Father. Jesus, through the words he addresses today, wishes to make us deeply convinced that God is interested not only in all humanity and great matters, but also in the fate of every human being. He wants us to understand who each of us is to God and that God cares for each person individually. Since God cares for every creature, even the smallest, like grass in the field or sparrows, all the more His fatherly concern embraces every man and woman.

Unfortunately, everything that involves the soul and spirit is clearly neglected by many people. Who thinks about the immortality of their soul and eternal life every day? Are we not more concerned about the state of our body than about the state of spiritual life? Do we satisfy our spiritual hunger? Do we have time everyday, for even a short examination of conscience, to consciously cultivate our own interior?

Słowo Proboszcza

Troska o duszę

W dzisiejszych czasach przecenia się wartość dóbr materialnych. Wielu ludzi nie może sobie wybaczyć np. stłuczki samochodu, gdyż stał się dla nich nieomal obiektem kultu. Inni złością się, gdy dziecko niechcący stłukło jakieś kosztowne szkło albo gdy się coś popsuło. Zbyt łatwo padamy ofiarą rzeczy lub sytuacji. Niezdany egzamin, np. matura, wywołuje u młodych ludzi myśli samobójcze. A przecież to jeszcze nie wszystkie źródła problemów: wiele osób na drugim miejscu po rzeczach materialnych stawia swoje ciało. Czegóż to się nie robi, aby poprawić wygląd.

Pielęgnacja ciała, troska o zdrowie, to działania właściwe, ale ile dzisiaj w tym przesady? Popatrzmy na to w kontekście dzisiejszej Ewangelii. Co Pan Jezus ma na myśli, mówiąc „Nie bójcie się tych, którzy zabijają ciało, lecz duszy zabić nie mogą.” Pan Jezus pragnie, abyśmy zrozumieli, jak bardzo Bogu zależy na każdym człowieku i jak wielka jest godność człowieka. Naszym zadaniem jest odnalezienie właściwej hierarchii wartości, dowartościowanie duchowego elementu naszego życia.

W wielu psalmach znajdujemy piękne strofy sławiące Boga Najwyższego jako ucieczkę, ostoję, obronę i pocieszenie dla ludzi, a dzisiejsza Ewangelia skłania do refleksji na temat tego, co w naszej ludzkiej egzystencji jest naprawdę istotne. Wspaniałe to słowa. Wynika z nich, z jak wielką łagodnością i troską traktuje nas Bóg – Ojciec. Jezus, przez słowa, które do nas dzisiaj kieruje, pragnie wzbudzić w nas głębokie przeświadczenie, że Bóg interesuje się nie tylko całą ludzkością i wielkimi sprawami, lecz także losem każdego człowieka. Chce, abyśmy zrozumieli, kim każdy z nas jest dla Boga i że Bogu zależy na każdym człowieku z osobna. Skoro Bóg troszczy się o każde stworzenie, nawet najmniejsze, jak trawa polna czy wróble, to tym bardziej Jego troska ojcowska obejmuje każdego człowieka.

Niestety, to wszystko, co wiąże się z duszą i duchem, jest przez wielu ludzi wyraźnie zaniedbywane. Kto na co dzień rozmyśla o nieśmiertelności własnej duszy, o życiu wiecznym? Czyż nie bardziej troszczymy się o stan naszego ciała aniżeli o stan życia duchowego? Czy zaspakajamy nasz głód duchowy? Czy mamy czas na codzienny, chociażby krótki rachunek sumienia, aby świadomie pielęgnować własne wnętrze?

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Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In the backyard of the house where I live with other priests, there is a lemon tree which produces a huge amount of fruit. One evening in the spring I needed some lemons for a chicken dish. I glanced from the kitchen and saw the tree bursting with large, bright, gorgeous lemons, hanging thick on seemingly every branch. Turning to Fr. Bob (I'll change his name to protect the innocent) who sat on the couch, I said, "Father, could you pick a few lemons for me?" He said sure and into the backyard he went. He returned a few minutes later empty-handed. "John, there's no lemons. Sorry." I said, "What are you talking about?" I looked again and saw the grapefruit tree on the other side of the yard, which had recently been picked clean of fruit. He didn't see the abundant fruit because he was looking in the wrong place!

Like Fr. Bob, we sadly don't see the fruit all around us. We think that the culture is spiraling down, young people avoid church, and the future looks bleak. Why go out into the world and work? The world looks like a fruitless tree.

Jesus doesn't see things that way. This week he tells us, "**The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few.**" Look again: there is spiritual fruit hanging all around us! The lonely ready to be visited. The sick ready to be healed. The forgotten ready to be remembered. The poor ready to be treated with dignity. The sad ready to be consoled. The young ready for the Gospel. So, let's ask the Lord to send laborers to get to work. And he will. He might send you and me. Just remember to look at the correct trees. — *Father John Muir*

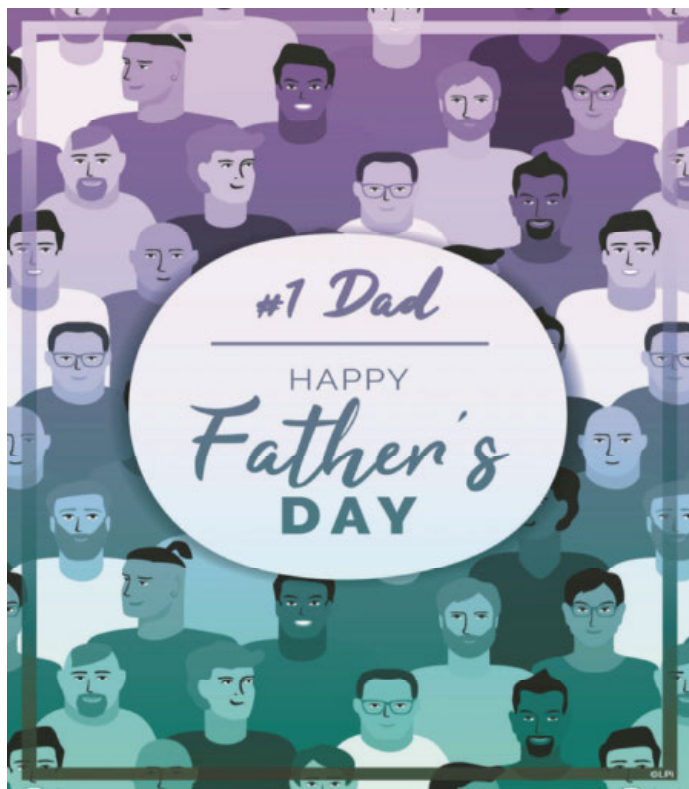

The Toy

What does it mean to be God's "special possession"? Our world is dominated by *things*, objects, possessions. To say we are a materialistic culture is an understatement. In that context, it can be really hard to fully appreciate the meaning of being "possessed" by God. I have so many possessions, after all. I acquire and discard them without thought. I am even overwhelmed by them. Sometimes, it feels like *they* possess me.

But then I think of the week after Christmas in a house with small children. In that week, there is always The Toy. The Toy that won the heart of your child under the tree, The Toy to which they emotionally attached themselves in a whirlwind of twinkle lights and sugar cookies. For that one week, The Toy is all there is. There were many gifts, but The Toy is special, and there can only be one.

So, what does it mean to be "possessed" by God? What does it mean to be of his people? It means you will be cherished and protected in ways you do not deserve and cannot understand. It means you are distinguished not by your own merit, but by the love with which you are beheld.

It means that you are always The Toy, and every day is Christmas.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

I've noticed that when I go to Mass at different parishes, sometimes people say and do different things. Why is that?

Answer:

The Mass in its current form has taken shape over the course of 2,000 years. Over time, traditions, structures, and prayers have been put into place. There are certain rubrics for the Mass that are normative wherever you go. This means you could attend Mass in Malawi or Thailand or Italy and still watch the same basic liturgy unfold, even if you don't understand the language. There may be some cultural differences from place to place, things that aren't specifically listed. For example, in the United States most people go up for Communion in a nice, neat line. In Europe, everyone gets up around the same time. It's a bit of a free-for-all!

Some people might take it upon themselves to change things individually. People may not like something that feels too "liberal" or "conservative," and they may take a well-meaning stance in the opposite direction. When people (including the presiders) do things that are distracting or change the liturgy, it introduces an element that breaks the unity of the assembled community. The important thing to remember is that we gather as the Body of Christ to celebrate the Eucharist. If you are confused, ask! If you are frustrated, pray for the spirit of charity.
