From the Pastor

Build For God a Home

The hospitable Shunammite opened the door of her house to Elisha. Her hospitality was rewarded: a childless marriage finally enjoyed the birth of a child.

Hospitality has resulted in a new life. Whoever receives Jesus receives a new life in God. When He comes to You, do at least as much as the Shunammite did to the prophet: prepare a room upstairs. May the Lord dwell permanently in your interior at the highest place. Let it be a built-in flat, because you need to build a place for God with your prayer and self-control. It was written: "A man without self-control is like a city broken into and left without walls." (Proverbs 25:28). And God will not dwell in an uncontrollable heart.

The Shunammite prepared for Elisha a bed. For you it is a sign that you must not fall asleep unless you have met God during the day. "I will not enter my house or get into my bed; I will not give sleep to my eyes or slumber to my eyelids, until I find a place for the Lord," (Psalms 132:3-5). There was also a table there, which meant the possibility of enjoying with the Lord not only the feast of love in the Eucharist, but also the smallest crumbs of his miraculous healings. Let there be a chair, meaning a throne, for Jesus in your spiritual life, so that you will not succumb to the temptation of pride and Pharisaic hypocrisy. About those kind of people the Bible says: "They love the place of honor at feasts and the best seats in the synagogues," (Matthew 23:6). Finally, put in your heart a lamp of God's word, that it may shine on a dark night of doubt and hesitation. Prepare your soul for a visit in this way, and certainly the reward of a new life will not pass you by in this life. When a person ascends to God - they will open the door of heaven with the key of repentance. When God enters a person's home, a loving hospitality of the heart is all it takes. Hospitality is the internal organization of the spirit that enables God's Spirit to dwell in us.

Słowo Proboszcza

Umebluj Bogu mieszkanie

Gościnną Szunemitka otworzyła drzwi swego domu Elizeuszowi. Jej gościnność została wynagrodzona: bezdzietne małżeństwo ucieszyło się narodzinami dziecka.

Gościnność zaowocowała nowym życiem. Kto przyjmuje Jezusa, otrzymuje nowe życie w Bogu. Kiedy On do Ciebie przychodzi, uczynź przynajmniej tyle, ile uczyniła Szunemitka prorokowi: przygotuj izbę na górze. Niech Pan zamieszka na stałe w Twoim wnętrzu na najwyższym miejscu. Niech to będzie mieszkanie obmurowane, ponieważ miejsce dla Boga trzeba obmurować swoją modlitwą i opanowaniem. Napisano przecież: „Miastem odkrytym, bez murów, jest człowiek nieopanowany” (Prz 25,28). A Bóg nie zamieszka w sercu nieopanowanym.

Szunemitka wstawiła Elizeuszowi łóżko. Dla ciebie to znak, że nie wolno ci zasnąć, jeśli nie spotkałeś się w ciągu dnia z Bogiem. „Nie wejdę do mieszkania w moim domu, nie wstąpię na posłanie mego łoża, nie użyczę snu moim oczom, powiekom moim spoczynku, póki nie znajdę miejsca dla Pana, mieszkania” (Ps 132,3–5). Był tam również stół, który oznacza możliwość spożywania z Panem nie tylko uczty miłości w Eucharystii, ale też najdrobniejszych okruszyn Jego cudownych uzdrowień. Niech w twoim życiu duchowym znajdzie się dla Jezusa i krzesło, czyli tron, abyś nie uległ pokusie pychy i faryzejskiej hipokryzji. O nich Biblia mówi: „Lubią zaszczytne miejsca na ucztach i pierwsze krzesła w synagogach” (Mt 23,6). Wreszcie wstaw do swego serca lampę słowa Bożego, aby świeciła ci w ciemną noc zwątpień i zawahań. Przygotuj swoją duszę na odwiedziny w ten sposób, a na pewno nagroda nowego życia nie ominie ciebie jeszcze w tym życiu. Kiedy człowiek wstępuje do Boga – drzwi nieba otworzy kluczem skruchy. Gdy Bóg wstępuje do domu człowieka, wystarczy pełna miłości gościnność serca. Gościnność jest wewnętrznym uporządkowaniem ducha, które umożliwia Duchowi Boga zamieszkanie w nas.

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Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was in middle school, there were times I didn't want my fellow students to see my parents drop me off or pick me up in the school parking lot. I was embarrassed of my parents. Why? I have no idea. Maybe it was our station wagon. Or I didn't want to look like a little kid. But in retrospect that was a silly thing to do. I was a kid. And I had two parents who loved me and had built a wonderful family. I was afraid of the other kids' judgment. How silly! I should have been afraid of forgetting or downplaying my family, which is where my identity had its deep roots.

This is a way to understand Jesus' words to his disciples this Sunday, when he says, "**Don't be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna.**" Fear, in this sense, refers to where we find our deepest identity and our highest love. That's why Jesus says next that when we acknowledge him before others, he will acknowledge us before the Father. It doesn't mean we're brash or boastful. But rather we unhesitatingly and humbly embrace our identity as followers of Jesus and children of God the Father. After all, if we love who we are and where we come from, who cares what the other kids think about us?

The Necklace

I have a necklace that originally belonged to my great-grandmother. I don't really know much about the man who gave it to her, most of those details have been lost to time. But I know that he wanted to marry her, and that she refused, and it had something to do with religion — ultimately, he did not share her faith. And while I've certainly seen many interfaith couples have loving and successful marriages, in this particular case, my great-grandmother discerned that this would not be one of those marriages.

Like I said, I don't have many details about this man, but I know that she felt she couldn't marry him because it might jeopardize the souls of her children, and therefore the souls of their children, and their children after them — me. She turned him down because of me.

My great-grandmother never sold that necklace, not even when the Great Depression further reduced her financial circumstances. She kept it, and she gave it to her daughter, who gave it to her daughter, who gave it to me. The necklace is always given with a warning: there is something worse than being poor, worse than being scared, worse even than being desperate. Worse than all of these things is separation from God.

When I wear this necklace, I think about my grandmother and this man she possibly loved a hundred years ago. I think of the many decisions we make every day — large and small, good and bad — that reverberate down through the generations in ways we cannot, at the time, imagine. I think of the God who knows every hair on my head.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

What is Lectio Divina, and how is it associated with the Benedictine Monastic tradition, whose founder, St. Benedict, we honor on July 11?

Answer:

Benedict desired his monks to live in community, praying the Liturgy of the Hours together, contemplating sacred texts, and doing manual labor. The monks developed a technique to facilitate a spiritual and devotional reading of the Bible known as Lectio Divina, the holy reading of a text. This method encourages the reader to hear the biblical text with an open heart and focus on whatever God wants to highlight and then apply it to daily life.

There are variations on Lectio Divina, but essentially, the technique consists of a three-step process of reflection. When the reflection is done with a group, the responses are shared by all the participants. Once the text is selected, it is read meditatively, and the following are then explored: a word or phrase that attracts you; how and where the content of this reading touches your life today; what you believe that God wants you to do during this coming week (month, year, lifetime).

Thanks to Benedict, the Christian community has been gifted with this special way of entering into the biblical text. This week, use the Lectio Divina process on one of the readings for the coming Sunday and make a note of the life connections you are making. How is this reflection on the biblical text drawing you closer to God and others?

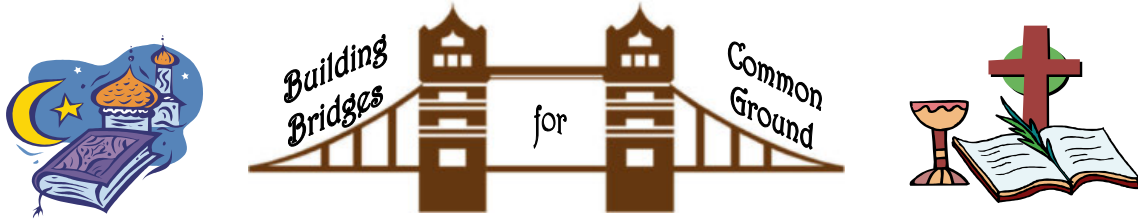
