Jesus took Peter, James, and his brother, John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. - Mt 17:1-2

From the Pastor

Binoculars of the Heart

Lonely prayers of Elijah, Paul and Jesus. Prayers done alone seem to be prayers of a misanthrope fleeing from society. You get the impression that this is a lack of concern for others. But the opposite is true. In prayer, when a person distances themselves physically from people, they become more and more aware of their responsibility for the fate of others.

Paul reveals his concern for the nation: I'd rather be under a curse for the salvation of my brothers! Amazing concern for the people who excommunicated the Apostle from the synagogue. In the sense of completely losing contact with others, it is impossible to be alone in prayer. Prayer makes distances between people disappear. Prayer can bring distances closer, and intimacy without prayer often leads to rejection!

Let's look at Jesus. By going up the mountain alone to pray, he does not abandon his disciples. It is thanks to this prayer that they have the power to put out into the sea and traverse it safely. By praying, we help others to travel through the dangerous stages of life and swim to the safe shore. Thanks to prayer, those who have even been lost from sight do not become lost from our hearts!

From time immemorial, the first activity of a thinking person was to turn to God. Morning prayer is a cry for support, for rescue! Very rightly so, because life is a dangerous sail, and therefore the first conscious act of a thinking person is to call for help. A morning prayer maybe even be a prayer of the wounded? A little sober thinking is often enough to get scared of existence alone. Without this cry, we sink even when it seems to us that we are "bigwigs". By skipping prayer, we become a toxic threat to others.

Though people of prayer fled into the desert, thousands followed. It was different with those who despised prayer, they became tyrants whose history are written with fatal testimonies. As long as you pray - you cry out for help, when you stop, others cry out for help when they see you!

It has never happened in life that prayer would increase someone's anxiety or lower someone's sense of security. Of all the powers that transform people, it is the most effective and most profound. You can get up completely transformed. Not only that, it also changes those for whom we pray! God is watching us constantly, but he becomes "active" only when we explicitly ask him to do so.

Słowo Proboszcza

Lornetka serca

Samotna modlitwa Eliasza, Pawła i Jezusa. Wydaje się, że modlitwa samotna jest modlitwą mizantropa uciekającego przed społeczeństwem. Można odnieść wrażenie, że to brak troski o innych. Ale jest wręcz odwrotnie. W modlitwie człowiek, oddalając się fizycznie od ludzi, coraz wyraźniej i mocniej uświadamia sobie odpowiedzialność za los innych.

Paweł odsłania swą troskę o naród: wołałbym być pod klątwą dla zbawienia braci moich! Zdumiewająca troska o ludzi, którzy ekskomunikowali Apostoła z synagogi. Samotność w modlitwie, w sensie zupełnej utraty kontaktu z innymi, jest niemożliwa. Modlitwa sprawia, że odległości pomiędzy ludźmi znikają. Modlitwa może sprawić, że odległości zbliżają, zaś zażyłość bez modlitwy często prowadzi do odtrącenia!

Spójrzmy na Jezusa. Wchodząc samotnie na górę, by się modlić, nie porzuca uczniów. To właśnie dzięki tej modlitwie mają oni moc wypłynąć na morską otchłań i ją bezpiecznie przemierzyć. Modląc się, pomagamy innym przewędrować niebezpieczne etapy życia i dopłynąć do zbawczego brzegu. Dzięki modlitwie nie giną nam z serca ci, których nawet zgubiliśmy z oczu!

Od niepamiętnych czasów pierwszą czynnością człowieka myślącego było zwrócenie się do Boga. Ranna modlitwa to wołanie o wsparcie, o uratowanie! Bardzo słusznie, bo życie jest niebezpieczną żegluga, i dlatego pierwszym świadomym aktem człowieka myślącego jest wołanie o pomoc. Modlitwa ranna to może nawet modlitwa zraniona? Odrobina trzeźwego myślenia często wystarcza, by się przerazić samym istnieniem. Bez tego wołania tonimy nawet wtedy, gdy wydaje nam się, że jesteśmy „grubymi rybami”. Omijając modlitwę, stajemy się dla innych toksycznym zagrożeniem.

Choć ludzie modlitwy uciekali na pustynię, ciągnęły za nimi tysiące. Inaczej miała się rzecz z tymi, którzy modlitwą wzgardzili, ci stali się tyranami, o których historia napisała fatalne świadectwa. Dopóki się modlisz – wołasz o pomoc, kiedy przestajesz, inni wołają o pomoc, widząc ciebie!

Nie zdarzyło się jeszcze w życiu, by modlitwa powiększyła komuś niepokój albo obniżyła poczucie bezpieczeństwa. Spośród wszystkich mocy przemieniających człowieka, najskuteczniejsza i najgruntowniejsza jest właśnie ona. Można po niej podnieść się kompletnie odmienionym. Mało tego, ona zmienia też tych, za których się modlimy! Bóg się nam przygląda nieustannie, ale „uaktywnia się” dopiero wtedy, gdy Go o to wyraźnie poprosimy.

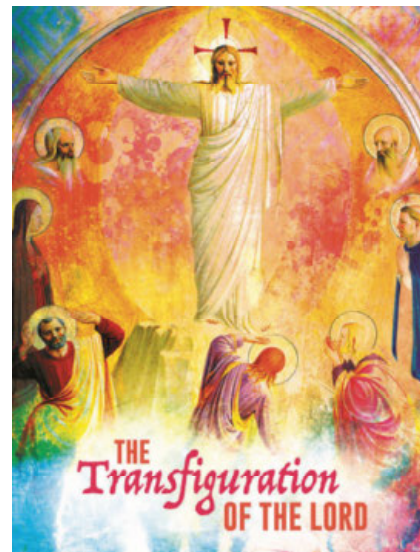

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Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

What is Christianity finally about? These days if you ask almost anyone who doesn't know the Bible you'll probably hear an answer like this: "Being a good person" or "following the golden rule." No offense to the golden rule, but our faith is simply much stranger than that. This week's feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord is a luminous example of this. Jesus becomes radiantly and overwhelmingly beautiful. The glory of God literally shines forth from his body and even his clothes. Here we see that Christianity is not mainly a moral system, but a relationship with God in Christ, one that finally makes human beings gloriously beautiful.

Now we can see our good and bad deeds in a new and de-centered way. Our morality isn't about a heaven or hell scorecard. It's about lives open (or closed) to transfiguration, lives capable of revealing the glory of God in Christ to the world. Spouses, children, friends, co-workers, priests, consecrated women and men, and so on — we are all called to let the beauty of Jesus make our lives beautiful, little by little. His beauty in us is the center of our faith.

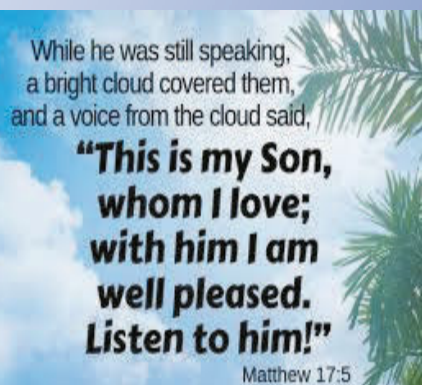

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why do Parishes Offer Special Masses like Thanksgiving and Memorial Day, even though they're not Holy Days of Obligation? Am I obligated to attend?

Answer:

Out of respect for the various civil celebrations that take place during the year, many dioceses and parishes will host special Masses. However, while it is always worthwhile to come together to worship as a community, Catholics are not obligated to attend these celebrations. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church notes, the only times that we are obligated to participate in celebrations of the Eucharist are on Sundays and holy days of obligation:

The first precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days.

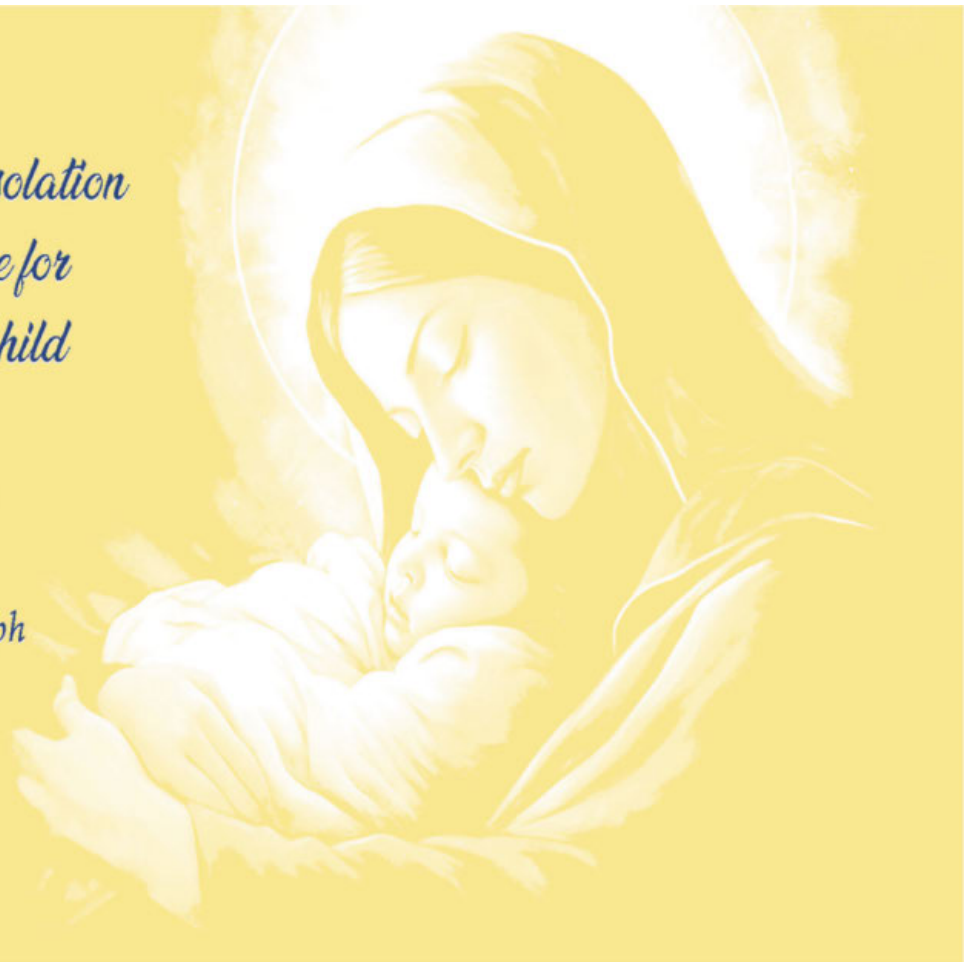
