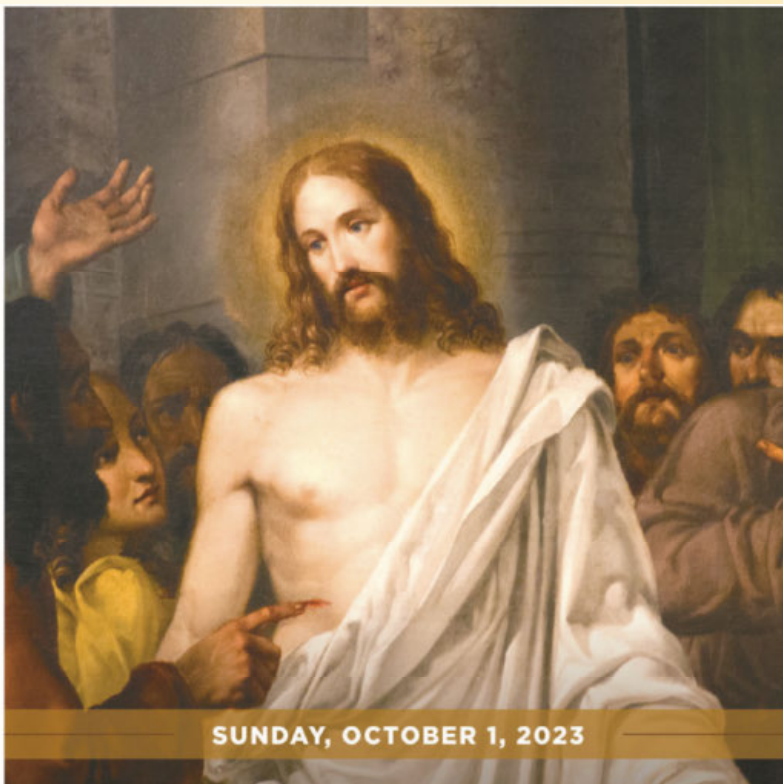

From the Pastor

Reflection on Decisions

There is always time to evaluate your own decisions. It can be seconds or only fractions of a second - but it is always there. It is only missing in instinctual action based on reflexes. Critically evaluating your own decision is an important element of wisdom. The ability to correct a wrong decision is a trait of wise people.

Do our verbal assurances about our readiness, for example, to provide support or help coincide with genuine openness with those who are next to us in need? Sometimes we would like to help, but unfavorable circumstances interfere with our plans, sometimes everything is favorable for us, but we ourselves are not able to decide and help. Ezekiel says: "Again, when a wicked man turns away from the wickedness he has committed and does what is lawful and right, he shall save his life. Because he considered and turned away from all the transgressions which he had committed, he shall surely live, he shall not die." (Ezekiel 18:27-28).

Words and deed are two simple concepts that mean a lot in our human reality. There are people who talk a lot and do little, there are people who promise a lot and do not keep their word. We don't like people who trick us into empty promises. Certainly, there are also many who can always be relied on and who do not make much noise about their actions, perhaps the words of Saint Paul in the letter to the Philippians will tell us something? "Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 2:4-5).

The parable of Christ about the behavior of the two sons is a clear indicator in this respect. Do we identify with either of them? Which is our role model? There is a mismatch between words and deeds. How can we benefit from today's parable for improving our own personality?

Analyzing the attitudes of both of them, let us look at the way we perform our duties, let us look at our neglect and the troubles it causes to others. Let our reflection on today's Word of God contribute to the fact that each next decision will be wiser than the previous one, and our verbal messages will be covered in deeds. "Truly, I say to you, the tax collectors and the harlots go into the kingdom of God before you." (Matthew 21:31). Let's think about these words ...

Słowo Proboszcza

Refleksja nad decyzjami

Jest zawsze chwila czasu, by ocenić własne decyzje. Może trwać ona tylko sekundy albo ułamki sekund – ale zawsze jest. Brakuje jej tylko w odruchowym działaniu. Krytyczna ocena własnej decyzji to istotny element mądrości. Umiejętność skorygowania błędnej decyzji jest cechą ludzi mądrych.

Czy nasze werbalne zapewnienia o gotowości np. do udzielenia wsparcia, pomocy pokrywają się z autentyczną otwartością i wyjściem naprzeciw w potrzebie tym, którzy są obok nas? Czasami bardzo byśmy chcieli pomóc, ale niesprzyjające okoliczności krzyżują nasze plany, czasami zaś wszystko nam sprzyja, ale my sami nie jesteśmy w stanie zdecydować się i pomóc. Ezechiel mówi: „jeśli bezbożny odstąpił od bezbożności, której się oddawał, i postępuje według prawa i sprawiedliwości, to zachowa duszę swoją przy życiu. Zastanowił się i odstąpił od wszystkich swoich grzechów, które popełniał, i dlatego na pewno żyć będzie, a nie umrze” (Ez 18,27-28).

Mowa i czyn to dwa proste pojęcia, które znaczą bardzo wiele w naszej ludzkiej rzeczywistości. Są ludzie, którzy dużo mówią, a robią niewiele, są tacy, co wiele obiecują i nie dotrzymują słowa. Nie lubimy osób niesłownych i takich, które nabierają nas na puste obietnice. Z pewnością jest także wielu takich, na których zawsze można polegać i którzy wokół swoich czynów nie robią wiele szumu, Może słowa świętego Pawła w liście do Filipian coś nam podpowiedzą? „Niech każdy ma na oku nie tylko swoje własne sprawy, ale też i drugih! To dążenie niech was ożywia; ono też było w Chrystusie Jezusie” (Flp 2,4-5).

Dobitnym wykładnikiem jest w tym zakresie przypowieść Chrystusa o zachowaniach dwóch synów. Czy identyfikujemy się z którymś z nich? Który jest dla nas wzorem? Mamy tu do czynienia z niezgodnością słów i czynów. Jakie korzyści możemy wyciągnąć z dzisiejszej przypowieści dla udoskonalenia własnej osobowości?

Analizując postawy ich obu, popatrzmy na sposób wypełniania przez nas swoich obowiązków, przypatrzmy się naszym zaniedbaniam i kłopotom sprawianym przez to innym. Niech nasza refleksja nad dzisiejszym Słowem Bożym przyczyni się do tego, że każda następna decyzja będzie mądrzejsza od poprzedniej, a nasze przekazy werbalne będą miały pokrycie w czynach. „Zaprawdę, powiadam wam: Celnicy i nierządnicę wchodzi przed wami do królestwa niebieskiego” (Mt 21,31). Przemyślmy sobie te słowa...

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A life-long Catholic friend of mine recently mumbled to me, "I can't stand all these converts to the faith. They're always rocking the boat." It surprised me because he is dedicated to evangelization, and yet he struggles with openness to new Catholics. It made me realize how easily I close my heart to those whom I perceive to be outsiders who become new members of the Catholic community. Almost unconsciously I reduce the world to the categories of "us" and "them." The result is that meaningful community silently shrinks in my life. Don't we all do that to some degree?

This week Jesus' punchy parable about the two sons blows up that black and white world. One son said he wouldn't get to work, and then did. The other said he would, and then he did not. **"Which did the will of his father?"** asks the Lord. Like so many of us, in identifying the first as the answer, the religious authorities manifest hidden hypocrisy in refusing to follow Jesus. They — like us — intuit the correct path but simply won't do it. The tax collectors and prostitutes are indeed following Jesus and thereby getting to work in the kingdom of God. *Everyone* is called to do God's will regardless of the labels we may apply to them.

This week let's reject the convenient but damaging categories of "insiders" and "outsiders." Instead, let's embrace a grateful attitude that Jesus is calling fallen, weak, and broken men and women like you and me. Then we begin to see that the tax collectors and prostitutes aren't *them*. They are *us*. And Jesus wants all of *us* working in his boat, no matter the rocking.
