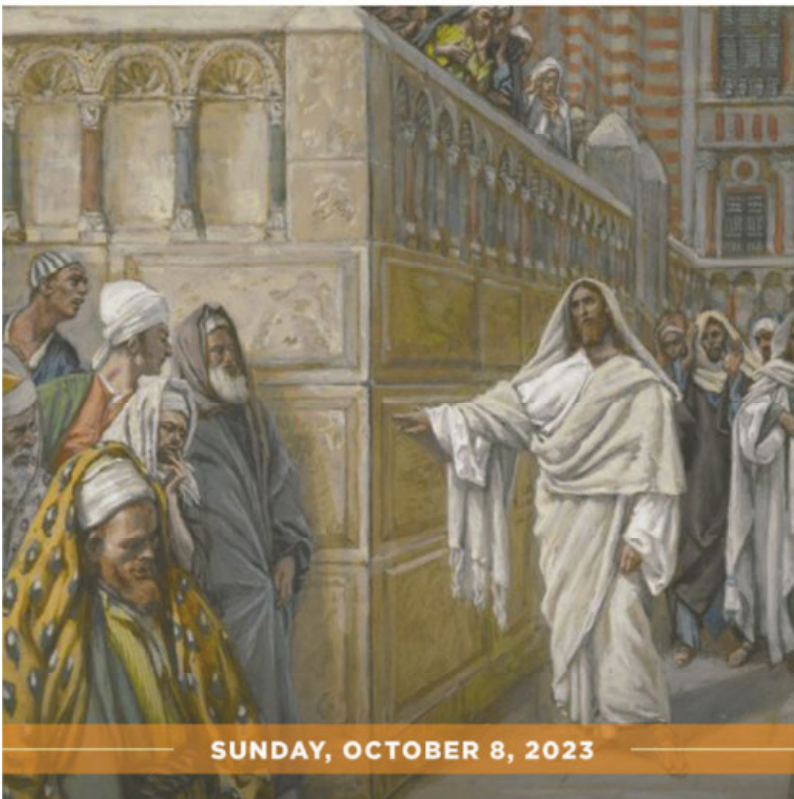

From the Pastor

Remember About the Gardens

The autumn climate causes our considerations to go to gardens, crops and harvests. Not all of us are familiar with the care of crops, but each of us is aware that in order to obtain a rich harvest, healthy fruits and vegetables, you need to spend a lot of time and energy on caring for trees, shrubs and plants.

It is the same with us: by being baptized, following the path of faith, deepening our faith, we mature so that we ourselves may become healthy fruits of faith. Chosen by God, we are His "fruits from the garden" manicured and tidy. But God is a good gardener, He wants His crops to be large, therefore - choosing a land for his vine garden - He leads His chosen people to the promised land until the weeds and grasses fall off and only the noble bushes remain. "For the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the house of Israel, and the men of Judah are his pleasant planting;" (Isaiah 5:7).

We too have the seeds of noble shrubs that can bear good and juicy fruit, but under several conditions: "What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, do; and the God of peace will be with you." (Philippians 4:9), Saint Paul tells us. What does this mean in practice? Involvement in prayer, in the spiritual realm, filling your life with thoughts about life, not only about life now, but also about life to which we are heading. If we make this effort, we will not be weeds, but noble shrubs that bear fruit pleasing to the Lord.

The parable of today's Gospel only confirms the earlier words spoken by the prophet Isaiah and confirmed by the words of Saint Paul in the Letter to the Philippians. God is the owner of the vineyard. It was he who established a special vineyard on Earth. It is not only the created world, it is primarily people. It is people whom God loves, but also people from whom God endures a lot - but we don't know if His patience is limitless. We, often disregarding justice, act calculatingly. God works out of love, always fairly. He gives everyone a chance, until the last moment, as long as possible. And this is the source of great hope for all who turn to God only very late.

Earlier, I mentioned that after baptism we become vineyards with good fruit. That is why every baptized person should accept Jesus as their Lord, follow him and live like a branch that is grafted onto a vine, which is Christ. Otherwise they will become a rejected stone, but who of us would like to be rolled down? After all, none of us would like to hear: "Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a nation producing the fruits of it." (Matthew 21:43).

Słowo Proboszcza

Pamiętajmy o ogrodach

Jesienny klimat powoduje, że nasze rozważania biegną ku ogrodom, plonom, dożynkom. Nie każdy z nas zna się na pielęgnacji upraw, ale każdy z nas zdaje sobie sprawę, że aby otrzymać obfite plony, zdrowe owoce, warzywa, trzeba poświęcić dużo czasu i sił na pielęgnację drzew, krzewów i roślin.

Podobnie jest z nami: przyjmując chrzest, krocząc ścieżką wiary, pogłębiając wiarę, dojrzewamy do tego, byśmy sami mogli stawać się zdrowymi owocami wiary. Wybrani przez Boga jesteście Jego „owocami z ogrodu” wypielęgnowanego i zadbanego. Ale Bóg jest dobrym ogrodnikiem, chce, by Jego plony były duże, dlatego – wybierając ziemię pod winny ogród – prowadzi swój lud wybrany do ziemi obiecanej tak długo, aż kąkole i chwasty odpadną, a zostaną same szlachetne krzewy. „Otóż winnicą Pana Zastępów jest dom Izraela, a ludzie z Judy szczepem Jego wybranym.” (Iz 5,7)

My również mamy w sobie załączki szlachetnych krzewów, mogących wydać dobre i soczyste owoce, wszakże pod kilkoma warunkami: „Czyńcie to, czego się nauczyliście, co przeżyliście, co usłyszeliście i co zobaczyliście u mnie, a Bóg pokoju będzie z wami.” (Flp 4,9), mówi nam święty Paweł. Co w praktyce to oznacza? Zaangażowanie w modlitwę, w sferę duchową, wypełnienie swego życia myślą o życiu, ale nie tylko doczesnym, lecz również tym, do którego zmierzamy. Jeśli podejmiemy ten wysiłek, to nie będziemy chwastami, ale szlachetnymi krzewami, które wydają owoce miłe Panu.

Przypowieść z dzisiejszej Ewangelii tylko potwierdza wcześniejsze słowa wypowiedziane przez proroka Izajasza i potwierdzone słowami świętego Pawła w Liście do Filipian. Gospodarzem winnicy jest Bóg. To On założył na ziemi szczególną winnicę. Jest nią nie tylko świat stworzony, jest nią przede wszystkim człowiek. Są nią ludzie, których Bóg kocha, ale też ludzie, od których Bóg znosi wiele, bardzo wiele – nie wiemy jednak czy Jego cierpliwość jest bezgraniczna. My, często nie licząc się ze sprawiedliwością, działamy z wyrachowaniem. Bóg działa z miłości, zawsze sprawiedliwie. Każdemu daje szansę, aż do ostatniego momentu, dopóki to możliwe. I to właśnie jest źródłem ogromnej nadziei dla wszystkich, którzy dopiero późno zwracają się do Boga.

Wcześniej już wspomniałem, że po chrzcie stajemy się winnicami, które mają wydać dobre owoce. Dlatego każdy ochrzczony powinien przyjąć Jezusa za swego Pana, iść za Nim i żyć jak latorośl wszczepiona w krzew winny, którym jest właśnie Chrystus. W przeciwnym razie stanie się odrzuconym kamieniem, ale kto z nas chciałby się stoczyć? Nikt z nas przecież nie chciałby usłyszeć: „Królestwo Boże będzie wam zabrane, a dane narodowi, który wyda jego owoce.” (Mt 21,43)

What will the owner of the vineyard do to those tenants when he comes?"

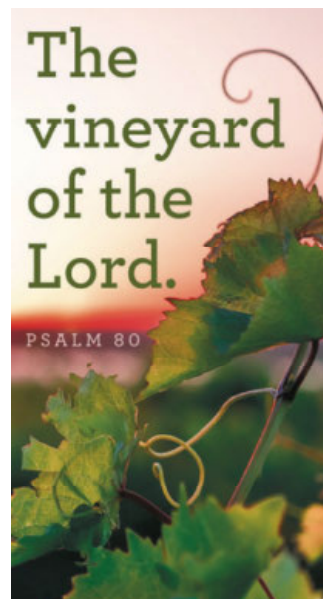
They answered him, "He will put those wretched men to a wretched death and lease his vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the proper times."

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Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Jesus' parables are much stranger than most people realize. This week is an attention-getting example. He tells the religious leaders a parable about a completely absurd situation. Blood-thirsty and insane tenants violently abuse and kill the servants of their landlord. Inexplicably, the owner keeps sending them more victims of increasing value — up to and including his own son. Weird.

Usually, we hear this parable and assume it's an allegory: Jesus is the murdered son, the servants the prophets, etc. Fair enough. But notice — and here is where the weirdness deepens — Jesus seems to *disagree* with the Pharisees' interpretation that the landowner should and will punish the inheritance-obsessed murderers. So, is Jesus praising the psychotic and greedy murderers?! You can imagine the furrowed brows and deriding laughter as the scoffing crowd shuffles away.

If we stay with this tough parable, perhaps this truth emerges: God wants us to have an over-the-top obsession with a *totally undeserved inheritance*. Of course, we are forbidden to use violence. But the parable's violence gets our attention because it highlights the crazy goodness of the landowner. Jesus reveals that God is not merely in the business of rewarding the good and punishing the bad. He is playing a much stranger game — one marked by a kind of over-the-top mercy, a breathtaking giving of what is *not* deserved. What would our week look like if we embraced this kind of desire for God's kingdom on earth, even if others think we're nuts? This week let's seek God's kingdom with a passionate confidence in God's desire to give the good things we don't deserve.

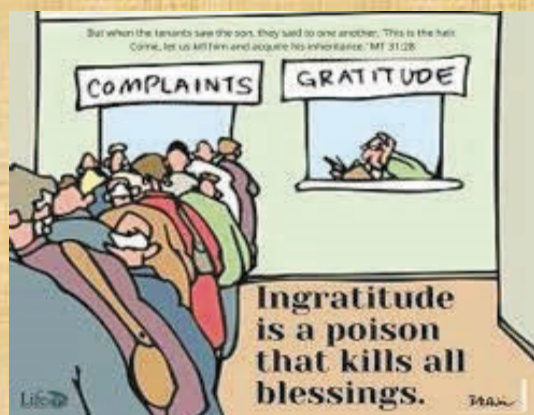

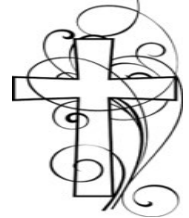

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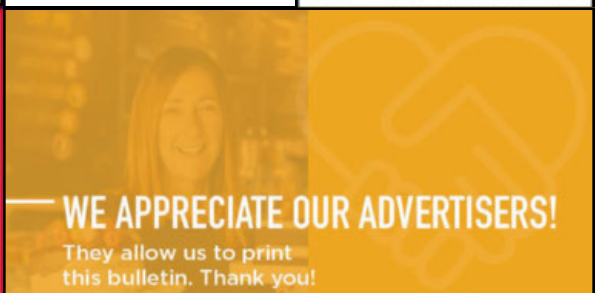
