From the Pastor

What is My Commandment?

The most important commandment is what you devote yourself to completely, meaning with passion. Is God your passion? The previous conversation with the Pharisees was a failure for them. So they wanted to test Jesus at the most sensitive point of religion. Jesus points out the inseparability of the commandments of love for God and love of neighbor. Characteristic is the reorientation of the emphasis of these commandments from a forbidden and passive form to a dictating and activating one. The text recorded in the Book of Exodus is negative: "You shall have no other gods," and also, in the last commandment, "You shall not covet your neighbor's house." Jesus says, "You will love your God with all your heart," and also, "You will love your neighbor." It has long been noticed that there is a danger of great evil when we do not do even a small good. Saint James wrote: "But whoever knows how to do good but does not do it, sins." The priceless Gutenberg's Bible, locked in a display case in the museum, is, however, less valuable than the threadbare one from which we read God's Word every day, having the opportunity to open it.

It is good to have abilities to which we devote ourselves wholeheartedly, but giving ourselves to loving God with all our heart is infinitely more valuable than self-realization. People spend a lot of energy developing their talents, dreams and plans. All of this becomes a personal "commandment" for them. An athlete spends a lot of time and energy to achieve the best results. Training is their most important "commandment" and victory may be a god for them! Doctors deepen their knowledge, skills and works tirelessly to become a specialist. However, will they be more interested in serving their neighbors with their skills, or in having the opinion of a specialist, and also taking advantage of higher salaries?

A cleric is involved in spiritual development because he or she wants to be ordained or vowed. But is that why they want to achieve it, because they care completely for God's friendship, or is it to feel more valuable or to live a selfish life without the hardships of family life? What really is their "commandment"? The scientist tries to solve complex issues, but is their "commandment" the good of their neighbor or their personal ambition? Each passion can be made into a specific interpretation of the commandment. What is really my "commandment" that motivates me? People make the most important "commandment" out of their interests, talents, ambitions, and talents. Meanwhile, the most important commandment should be human passion, ambition and interest. And the most important thing is to love God and your neighbor!

Słowo Proboszcza

Co jest moim przykazaniem?

Najważniejszym przykazaniem jest to, czemu poświęcasz się całkowicie, czyli z pasją. Czy Bóg jest twoją pasją?

Poprzednia rozmowa z faryzeuszami była dla nich porażką. Pragnęli więc wypróbować Jezusa w najwrażliwszym punkcie religii. Jezus wskazuje na nierozdzielność przykazań miłości Boga i miłości bliźniego. Charakterystyczna jest reorientacja akcentów tych przykazań z zakazującej i biernej formy na nakazującą i aktywizującą. Tekst zapisany w Księdze Wyjścia brzmi negatywnie: „Nie będziesz miał cudzych bogów”, a także, w ostatnim przykazaniu: „Nie będziesz pożądał domu bliźniego”. Jezus mówi: „Będziesz miłował całym sercem swego Boga”, a także: „Będziesz miłował bliźniego”. Już dawno zwrócono uwagę na niebezpieczeństwo zaistnienia wielkiego zła, gdy nie czynimy nawet małego dobra. Święty Jakub zapisał: „Kto zaś umie dobrze czynić, a nie czyni, grzeszy”. Bezcenna Biblia Gutenberga, zamknięta w gablocie w muzeum, jest jednak mniej wartościowa niż ta wyświechtana, z której codziennie odczytuję Słowo Boga, mając możliwość jej otwierania.

Dobłą rzeczą jest posiadać zdolności, którym oddajemy się całym sercem, ale oddawanie się całym sercem miłowaniu Boga jest nieskończenie wartościowsze niż samorealizacja. Ludzie poświęcają mnóstwo energii na to, by rozwinąć swoje uzdolnienia, marzenia i plany. Wszystko to staje się dla nich osobistym „przykazaniem”. Sportowiec poświęca ogromnie dużo czasu i sił, by osiągnąć najlepsze efekty. Trening jest dla niego najważniejszym „przykazaniem”, a zwycięstwo może być dla niego bogiem! Lekarz pogłębia swoją wiedzę, umiejętności i niezmordowanie pracuje nad tym, by stać się specjalistą. Czy jednak bardziej będzie mu zależało, by swymi umiejętnościami służyć bliźnim, czy na tym, by mieć opinię specjalisty, a także skorzystać z wyższych wynagrodzeń?

Osoba duchowna zaangażuje się w rozwój duchowy, bo pragnie dojść do święceń albo ślubów. Ale czy dlatego chce to osiągnąć, bo zależy jej całkowicie na przyjaźni Boga, czy też dlatego, by poczuć się wartościowszym albo żyć samolubnie, nie ponosząc trudów życia rodzinnego? Co naprawdę jest jej „przykazaniem”? Naukowiec próbuje rozwiązać zawiłe kwestie, ale czy jego „przykazaniem” jest dobro bliźniego, czy osobista ambicja? Można każdą pasję uczynić swoistą interpretacją przykazania. Co naprawdę jest moim „przykazaniem”, które mnie motywuje? Ludzie ze swoich zainteresowań, uzdolnień, ambicji, talentów czynią najważniejsze „przykazanie”. A tymczasem właśnie najważniejsze przykazanie powinno być pasją, ambicją i zainteresowaniem człowieka. A najważniejsze jest miłować Boga i bliźniego!

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In our secularized culture, we all struggle with belief in God, at least to some degree. An atheist man named Robert Bridges once wrote to his friend, the Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins, asking how he could possibly learn to believe in God. Hopkins pithily responded: "Give alms." Would that help someone tempted by atheism today, like you and me?

I think so, and here's why. This week Jesus speaks of love for God and neighbor. These dual commands were nothing new when Jesus used them to sum up the Jewish law. What is new is the way he links them together in mutual dependency. In Jesus, God and man have become one. Human-love and God-love are now inseparably married forever.

The newness of the God-man means that there is now a permanently counter-intuitive way into the knowledge and love of God: love of our neighbor. To experience charity is to know God. That's what Hopkins was getting at for his friend. How we treat our fellow human beings is inseparable from faith in God. Do you want to have a stronger sense of God's loving presence and goodness? Commit to serving someone today and this week. Love him or her. Don't wait for love for God to appear in your heart before loving others. Jesus has united divine and human love. If you want to believe more in God, give alms.

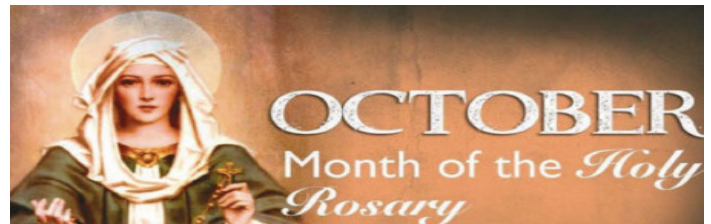

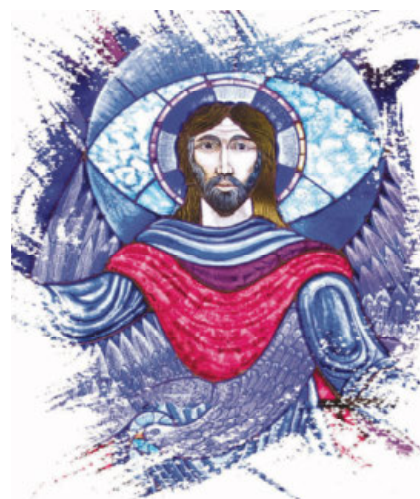
