From the Pastor

I Believe that I will Rise Again

One widower suffers from the death of his wife, who died two years earlier after a short but devastating illness. After she left, he understood how much she meant in their marriage, in caring for their children, in the many friendships they had made together. He is still haunted by some questions to which he is looking for answers: "I dream about her often. Do you think I'll meet her again when I die? Will I get to know her and be able to hug her? "

St. Paul the Apostle in the First Letter to the Thessalonians, confesses: "If we believe that Jesus really died and rose, God will also bring out those who died in Jesus with him." Resurrection is not about returning to the present life or resurrecting a corpse, but about sharing in the life of a God who is not God of the dead but of the living. Faith in the resurrection leads us to Christian hope. As retired Pope Benedict XVI said in an interview a few years ago: "I'm on the last stretch of my life and I don't know what awaits me. But I know that there is God's light, that He is Risen, that His light is stronger than all darkness, that God's goodness is stronger than all evil in this world. "

When a loved one dies, the heart cannot be made of stone, so it cries. We are allowed to cry, we are allowed to grieve because Christ also wept over the death of his friend, Lazarus. It is a natural instinct of human nature that flinches at the face of sorrow, suffering and death. The Scriptures point out that our sorrow cannot become just a feeling or an emotion that in no way brings us closer to the reality of eternal life. This natural sorrow is to dispel all doubts and strengthen our faith and hope in fulfilling the promise of the resurrection. From this reality of pain we are to rise to the reality of experiencing the joy that flows from the miracle of Christ's resurrection and our resurrection.

That is why we come to Christ to seek answers to these difficult, but very specific, questions of life. It is Jesus Christ, the Risen One, who shows us that "the glory of God is the living man" (Saint Irenaeus), who was created to live forever. "In him the hope of a glorious resurrection shone forth for us, and though we are saddened by the inevitable necessity of death, we find comfort in the promise of future immortality" (Preface I about the Dead). Christ is our entire hope, because "He leads us to the Father, Love becomes the law of life. Christ is our peace, our reconciliation. "

In Christ's death, there is no annihilation: it is death that leads to being immersed in God who himself took the human body so that people could become immortal. With our eyes fixed on Christ, we should learn to think of the dead as living. Faith in the resurrection can illuminate the last moments of those who are leaving, and those who remain can bring relief from a painful separation and encourage them to be alert and ready to meet the Lord.

Słowo Proboszcza

Ja wierzę, że zmartwychwstanę

Jeden z wdowców cierpi po śmierci żony, która zmarła dwa lata wcześniej po krótkiej, lecz wyniszczającej chorobie. Po jej odejściu zrozumiał, ile znaczyła w ich małżeństwie, w opiece nad dziećmi, w licznych przyjaźniach, jakie wspólnie nawiązywali. Wciąż nie dają mu spokoju pewne pytania, na które szuka odpowiedzi: „Ona często mi się śni. Myślisz, że spotkam się z nią ponownie, kiedy umrę? Czy ją poznam i będę mógł ją objąć?”.

Św. Paweł Apostoł w Pierwszym Liście do Tesaloniczan wyznaje: „Jeśli bowiem wierzymy, że Jezus istotnie umarł i zmartwychwstał, to również tych, którzy umarli w Jezusie, Bóg wyprowadzi wraz z Nim”. Zmartwychwstanie nie polega na powrocie do obecnego życia ani na wskrzeszeniu zwłok, ale na uczestnictwie w życiu Boga, który nie jest Bogiem umarłych, lecz żywych. Wiara w zmartwychwstanie prowadzi nas do chrześcijańskiej nadziei. Jak powiedział emerytowany papież Benedykt XVI w jednym z wywiadów kilka lat temu: „Jestem na ostatnim odcinku drogi mego życia i nie wiem, co mnie czeka. Wiem jednak, że jest światło Boga, że jest Zmartwychwstały, że Jego światło jest silniejsze od wszelkiej ciemności, że dobroć Boga jest silniejsza od wszelkiego zła na tym świecie”.

W obliczu śmierci bliskiej osoby serce nie potrafi być z kamienia, dlatego płacze. Wolno nam płakać, wolno się smucić bo i Chrystus zapłakał nad śmiercią przyjaciela, Łazarza. To naturalny odruch ludzkiej natury, która wzdyga się wobec smutku, cierpienia, wobec śmierci. Pismo Święte zwraca uwagę na to, że nasz smutek nie może zostać tylko wzruszeniem czy emocją, które w żaden sposób nie przybliżają nas do rzeczywistości życia wiecznego. Ten naturalny smutek ma rozwiązać wszelkie wątpliwości i wzmocnić w nas wiarę i nadzieję w wypełnienie obietnicy zmartwychwstania. Z tej rzeczywistości bólu mamy się wznieść do rzeczywistości doświadczenia radości wypływającej z cudu zmartwychwstania Chrystusa i naszego zmartwychwstania.

Dlatego przychodzimy do Chrystusa, by szukać odpowiedzi na te trudne, ale jakże konkretne życiowe pytania. To Jezus Chrystus zmartwychwstały pokazuje nam, że „chwała Boga jest człowiek żyjący” (św. Ireneusz), który został stworzony, by żyć wiecznie. „W Nim zabłysła dla nas nadzieja chwalebnego zmartwychwstania i choć nas zasmuca nieunikniona konieczność śmierci, znajdujemy pociechę w obietnicy przyszłej nieśmiertelności” (I Prefacja o zmarłych). Chrystus jest całą naszą nadzieją, ponieważ „On do Ojca nas prowadzi, Miłość czyni życia prawem. Chrystus naszym jest pokojem, naszym pojednaniem”.

W śmierci Chrystusa nie dochodzi do unicestwienia: jest to śmierć prowadząca do zanurzenia w Bogu, który sam przyjął ciało ludzkie, by człowiek mógł stać się nieśmiertelny. Zapatrzeni w Chrystusa, powinniśmy nauczyć się myśleć o zmarłych jako o osobach żyjących. Wiara w zmartwychwstanie potrafi bowiem rozświetlić ostatnie chwile tych, którzy odchodzą, a tym, którzy zostają przynieść ulgę w bolesnym rozstaniu i zachęcić do modlitewnej czujności i gotowości na spotkanie z Panem.

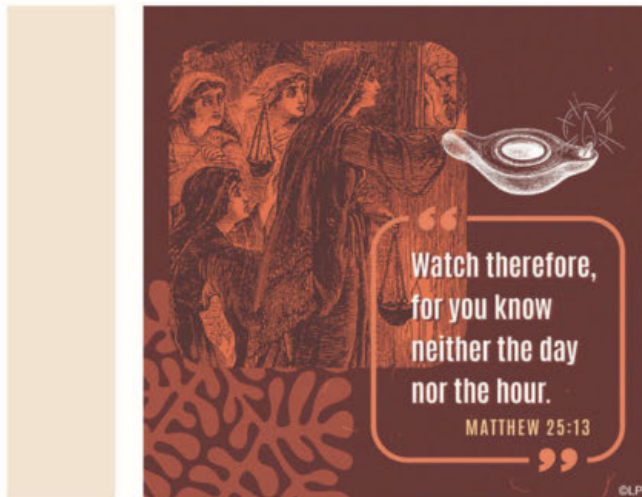

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Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Lately I've been enjoying the deep meaning of Eastern icons. I love how they express a tapestry of meaning in a way that can surpass the written or spoken word. Today's parable of the ten virgins from Jesus is a good example. Try googling "wise and foolish virgins icon" and you'll see an image of how our Christ meets our heart's deepest needs if we attend to him with the proper attitude.

I'm serious. Take a moment to google and look at it. See how it depicts the risen Jesus behind a closed door with the five wise virgins with lighted lamps. He gazes with them toward the five foolish and lamp-less virgins, symbolizing the outward looking of divine love for the lost. Moreover, the wedding feast is no ordinary one. It takes place in a walled city and garden, indicating it's a new Jerusalem and a return to Eden. The table isn't typical, either. It's a Eucharistic feast. Now we see that the door in Jesus' parable is the way into the church, where Christ is the new light burning amidst the dark midnight of this world.

The richness continues. We notice, too, that the foolish virgins look *exactly* the same as the wise ones in their clothes, hair, and expressions. The only difference is they departed to buy oil and now they are sadly excluded. We often act like consumers in the marketplace to fulfill our need for love and mercy. We'll always end up disappointed if we shop around. Jesus sums up the moral of the story this way: **"Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour."** Watch, remain, don't spiritually shop. It is always better to quietly remain close to the Eucharistic community of the Church, even if we feel like our oil has run out. This week let's consider placing the icon of the wise and foolish virgins on our phone lock screen or computer desktop to help us remember to stay close to him, especially when life feels dark. — *Father John Muir*

Women's Dialogue Groupe 25th Anniversary Tea

On Saturday, October 14, 2023, the St. Fabian/Mosque Foundation Women's Dialogue Group held their 25th Anniversary Tea. This group, for 25 years, is the longest running Women's Interfaith Dialogue in the country and works to support the Chicago Archdiocese Office of Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs' mission statement "... seeking to nurture understanding and respect among all religious groups through dialogue, formation, prayer, and collaboration in civic affairs that promote the common good." Close to 70 women gathered at Universal School in Bridgeview. Janet Pawlicki and Huma Murad presided over the event. Several Middle Eastern Teas were presented by our Muslim sisters to compliment all the appetizers/ desserts that were brought by the participants.

Vi Bosworth and Dalila Benameur reflected on the past ... how and why this group began. Formed before 9/11, the women provided comfort and aid to their neighbors when it was needed. Two members of our group (Paula Daley and Karen Danielson) participated in the Parliament of World Religions Symposium held in Utah in 2015. We continue to share common threads of faith and family with the community.

Andreatte Brachman and Asma Atek talked about the present. They reviewed how their meetings were held beginning and ending with prayer from both sides. Outreach events like the many yearly dinners alternating locations with many worthwhile speakers, visiting our local nursing home and providing meals three times a year for Beds Plus and the Crisis Center. They talked about the real friendships that have been formed over these years.

After presentations, Huma Murad read a letter from Aisheh Said, the Sheikh's wife, congratulating our group on its longevity and ability to foster meaningful friendships. In addition to this letter, we also received a note from Sheikh Jamal who concluded that "In a world often marked by division, your partnership has been a source of inspiration and hope."

The afternoon ended with table discussions on what the future will hold for our group. We were so pleased with the many suggestions, including mother/daughter teas and recipe exchange get togethers. Be on the lookout for new things to come.
