From the Pastor

Talent

What is talent? In antiquity, it was the largest unit of measure of both weight and money. Today, this word denotes outstanding abilities in some field. You cannot acquire talent by your own efforts. Talent is a gift, and gifts are shared by everyone and can be very different.

Talent is not only outstanding abilities, but also the ability to care for others, the ability to communicate with others and treat each other without criticism and envy, the ability to listen, ability ... it would take a long time to list various gifts. We develop and enrich our talents through love, joy and prayer. However, are we aware that each "talent" is a call and a commitment to work on ourselves and to work for others?

Today's Gospel shows the typical behavior of a lazy servant, a man who does not make sure that the gifts he receives are multiplied and bear fruit. Leaving talents unfruitful is a fault that deserves the biblical type of "weeping and gnashing of teeth" or, as we would say today, stupidity and laziness. Let us draw a moral from this story, a moral that teaches us what is the fear of God completely different from the false fear: false fear is based on human reckoning and distrust of God, while the fear of God is not fear, but is a gift of the Holy Spirit, thanks to which people fear to offend God, to make him grieve, or fail to do His will.

The true fear of God is one who "walks in his ways" (Psalms 128), like two servants praised by the Lord with the words: "Well done, good and faithful servant...enter into the joy of your master" (Matthew 25:21 and 23).

Whoever has received more is to give more of themselves, and although it requires greater effort on the part of people, the reward will be disproportionately greater. This is the conclusion of today's parable of the talents. Therefore, let us not envy others their talents, let us take care of our own development, let our lives be creative, and multiply the gifts received from God. After our transition from mortality to everlasting life, we will report on the use of the talents given to us. It may then turn out that the talent given to us was the ability to perform the necessary, simple activities, and conscientiousness in fulfilling daily duties has become our pass to eternal happiness.

Słowo Proboszcza

Talent

Co to jest talent? W starożytności była to największa jednostka miary – zarówno wagi, jak i pieniądza. Dzisiaj tym słowem określa się wybitne zdolności w jakiejś dziedzinie. Talentu nie można zdobyć własnymi siłami. Talent jest darem, a dary są udziałem każdego człowieka i mogą być bardzo różne.

Talent to nie tylko wybitne zdolności, lecz także zdolność do opieki nad innymi, umiejętność porozumiewania się z innymi i wzajemnego traktowania się bez krytykanctwa i zazdrości, umiejętność słuchania, umiejętność... długo można by wymieniać różne dary. Nasze talenty rozwijamy i wzbogacamy przez miłość, radość i modlitwę. Czy jednak uświadamiamy sobie, że każdy „talent” jest wezwaniem i zobowiązaniem do pracy nad sobą samym i do pracy dla innych?

Dzisiejsza Ewangelia ukazuje typowe zachowanie leniwego sługi, człowieka, który nie dba o to, aby otrzymane dary pomnażały się i przynosiły owoc. Pozostawienie talentów bezowocnymi jest winą, która zasługuje na określenia typu biblijnego „płacz i zgrzytanie zębów” lub, jak powiedzielibyśmy dzisiaj: głupota i lenistwo. Wyciągnijmy morał z tej opowieści, morał uczący nas, na czym polega bojaźń Boża całkowicie różna od bojaźni fałszywej: bojaźń fałszywa opiera się na rachubie ludzkiej i nieufności wobec Boga, natomiast bojaźń Boża nie jest strachem, lecz jest darem Ducha Świętego, dzięki któremu człowiek boi się Boga obrażać, zasmucać i nie wypełniać Jego woli. Prawdziwą bojaźń Bożą ma ten, kto „chodzi drogami Pana” (Ps 128), jak dwaj słudzy pochwaleni przez Pana słowami: „Dobrze sługo dobry i wierny... wejdź do radości twego pana” (Mt 25,21 i 23).

Kto otrzymał więcej, ten ma dać z siebie więcej i chociaż wymaga to ze strony człowieka większego wysiłku, nagroda za to będzie niewspółmiernie większa. Taki wniosek wypływa z dzisiejszej przypowieści o talentach. Nie zazdrośćmy więc innym ich talentów, troszczmy się o własny rozwój, o to, aby nasze życie było twórcze, abyśmy pomnażali dary otrzymane od Boga. Po naszym przejściu z życia doczesnego do życia wiecznego będziemy zdawać relację z wykorzystania danych nam talentów. Może się wtedy okazać, że danym nam talentem była umiejętność wykonywania niezbędnych, prostych czynności, a sumienność w wypełnianiu codziennych obowiązków stała się naszą przepustką do szczęśliwości wiecznej.

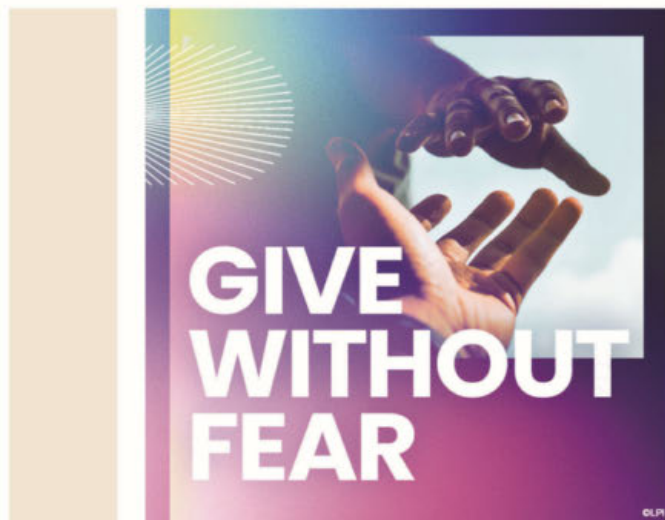

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Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was a kid, I hated playing Monopoly because my siblings and friends always seemed to win. But worse was how it happened. Scared to risk my fake money on buying properties, I'd hold on to it. My opponents hungrily bought up the various real estate squares on the board. Then, inevitably, my poor, low-equity self would land on their spots, pay them rent, and my money would drain to zero. It seemed so unfair. The rich get richer, and the poor get poorer. I had to learn that monopoly money is meant to be spent. I was scared to lose some of it. So, I lost all of it.

How do we see what we possess? Jesus' parable about the talents is not really about economics but about the investability of everything he entrusts to us. How marvelous that everyone in the fable who places talents in the open market doubles their investment. The only one who doesn't is the man who fearfully buries his one talent. Jesus' success strategy for us seems to be, whatever we have, get it out of our *possession*. Risk it as quickly and as fully as we can.

You and I have precious gifts. We have valuable things to invest — time, talents, treasure. The Lord invites us to be brave and even somewhat reckless, to give as much away as possible. If we give it away in the direction of love and truth, it will grow. If we hold on to it in fear, the little we have will be taken away. Let me challenge you this week: find something in your life you're holding on to, and risk it by giving it away. It won't double if you hold on to it.
