Apart from Him, no one has been called a King because of His dignity, for His kingdom is above all creatures and surpasses them, it is their prototype. And if he had walked on our world today as he did 2,000 years ago, he would probably use the mass media. However, we can say with certainty that His words, gestures and deeds would reach us all with equal clarity.

Today the Church wishes to make us aware of the fullness of life and happiness in Christ our Lord. He entered the glory of the Father, passing from death to life, in order to give us all new courage from this glory to do good that directs us to eternal life. As we read in the Gospel, there is an unambiguous and unbreakable relationship between our life and our deeds and the world to come, which we ultimately prepare for ourselves. Our God wants to offer us joy not only in the Kingdom of eternal life, but also wants our mortal life to be better than what we do for it ourselves or is done to it by those who rule this earthly world. God wants our present life - subjected to various trials of suffering and poverty - to recover from degrading, enslaving sin, from the shadow of death. Through his loving providence, he wants us to know him for the Father who always wants the best for everyone. He wants us to be aware of our belonging to the Kingdom of Christ, to cooperate in building a civilization of love and in fulfilling His promises. So, today's feast should make us unequivocally realize that Christ is the KING of hearts, the King of goodness, love, unity, peace, the King of trust, hope, faithfulness, the King of transformation of this world and of the "inner life" of every individual human being. Christ wants to build HIS KINGDOM where people, with many possibilities, are always ready to help others in any situation. He wants to build and enlarge His Kingdom in the hearts of those who serve HIM in humility.

Słowo Proboszcza

Zwycięzca

Poza Nim nikt nie był nazywany Królem z powodu dostojności, boć to Jego królestwo wyprzedza wszystkie stworzenia i przewyższa je, jest ich pierwowzorem. A gdyby kroczył tak, jak 2000 lat temu, dzisiaj, to zapewne korzystałby ze środków masowego przekazu. Prawdopodobnie jednak wszelką pewnością można stwierdzić, że Jego słowa, gesty i czyny z taką samą wyrazistością docierałyby do nas wszystkich.

W dniu dzisiejszym Kościół pragnie nam uświadomić pełnię życia i szczęścia w Chrystusie naszym Panu. On wszedł do chwały Ojca przechodząc ze śmierci do życia, aby z tej chwały dodać nam wszystkim nowej odwagi do pełnienia dobra, która kieruje nas ku życiu wiecznemu. Jak czytamy w tekście Ewangelii, pomiędzy naszym życiem i naszymi uczynkami a przyszłym światem, który ostatecznie przygotowujemy sobie sami, zachodzi jednoznaczny i nierozwalny związek. Nasz Bóg pragnie nam zaoferować radość nie tylko w Królestwie życia wiecznego, ale pragnie także, aby nasze życie doczesne było lepsze niż sprawiamy to sami sobie lub też sprawiają ci, którzy rządzą tym światem doczesnym. Bóg pragnie nasze obecne życie - poddane różnym próbom cierpienia i biedy – wydobyć z poniżającego, zniewalającego grzechu, z cienia śmierci. Poprzez swoją, pełną miłości Opatrzność chce, abyśmy znali Go za Ojca, który zawsze i dla każdego chce tego, co najlepsze. Chce, abyśmy mieli świadomość naszej przynależności do Królestwa Chrystusowego, abyśmy współpracowali przy budowaniu cywilizacji miłości i przy realizacji Jego obietnic. Tak, więc dzisiejsze święto powinno nam jednoznacznie uświadomić, że Chrystus jest KRÓLEM serc, Królem dobroci, miłości, jedności, pokoju, Królem ufności, nadziei, wierności, Królem przemiany tego świata i „życia wewnętrznego” każdego poszczególnego człowieka. Chrystus chce SVOJE KRÓLESTWO budować tam, gdzie ludzie przy wielu możliwościach są zawsze gotowi pomóc innym w każdej sytuacji. Chce budować i powiększać Swe Królestwo w sercach tych, którzy MU służą w pokorze.

Reading 2: 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28

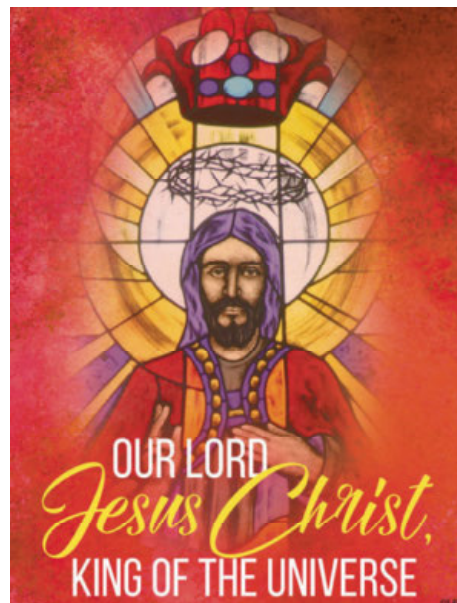
Brothers and sisters:

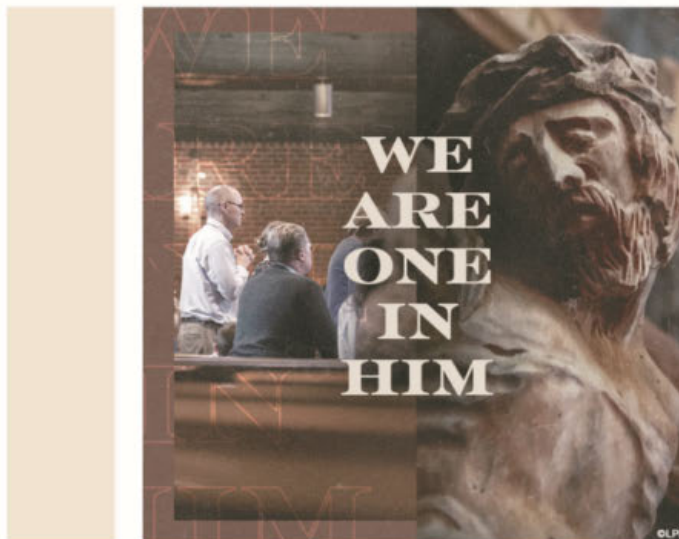

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Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In May 2023, for the first time in almost three quarters of a century, a monarch was crowned in England. A few days later a friend of mine scoffed, "What a waste of time and energy! What is the point of a king?"

I'm a proud American who wants neither theocracy nor monarchical restoration. I like our democratic republic. But the coronation of King Charles reminded me of something needed in every person and community: confidence in the future. The king's most basic role is to symbolize the unity of the nation. In England, the parliament members handle many of the practical duties of governance. But the king or queen can do what they cannot: embody in a single person the reality and future of a whole nation. To say, "this is our king" is to say, "we exist as a community, and we have a future." Kingship isn't primarily about the power of one person or family. It's about the enduring identity and unity of the whole.

To say Christ is our King is to say we exist as a people. We are one in him. We are, and we will be as long as he is. And since he will be our risen king forever, together we have a future filled with hope. Even the best countries will finally fall. But Christ and his Church will endure forever. What good news! It's not a waste of time to crown a king. We do it all the time. Let's be sure to crown the right one — the one whose kingdom never ends.

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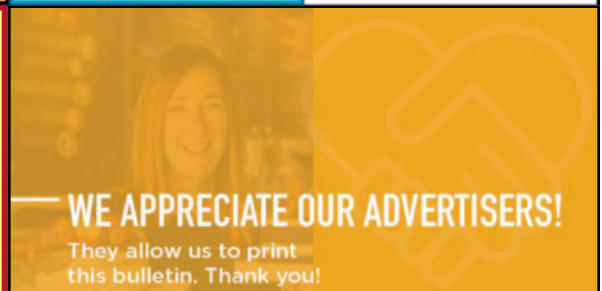
