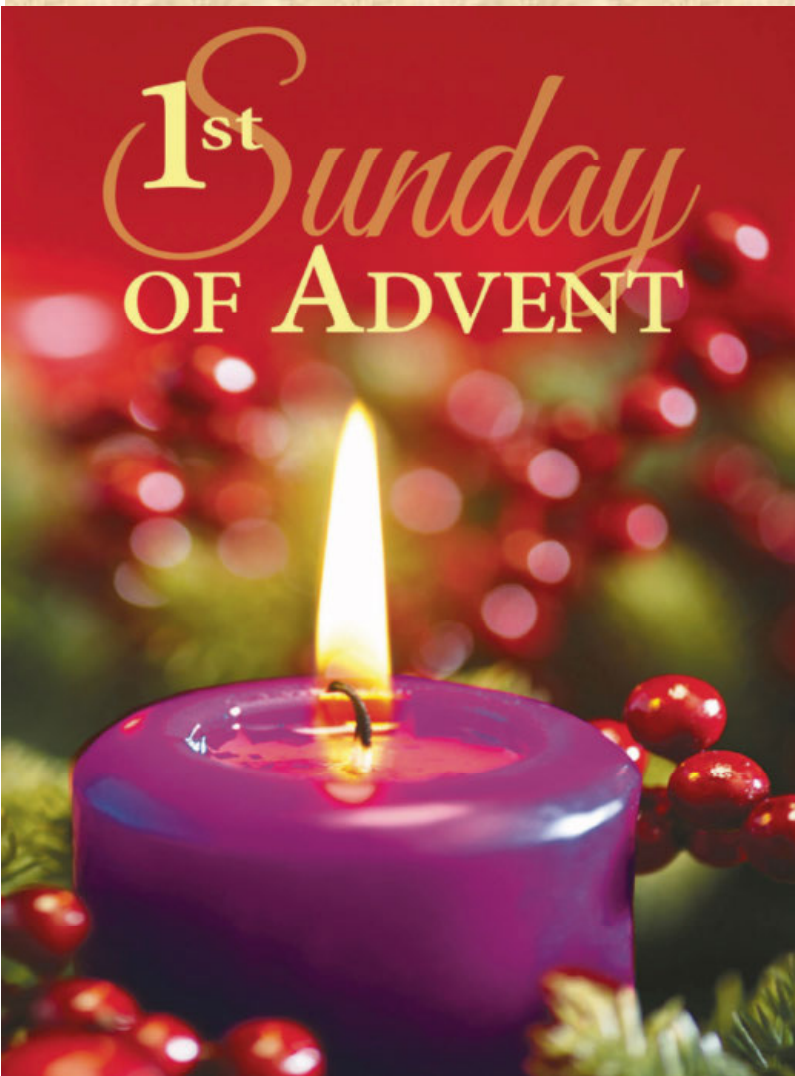

From the Pastor

The Leaven and the Wait

A leaven is, in the speech of bakers and confectioners, a small portion of a special mass that is necessary to loosen the dough prepared for the production of baked goods. In our lives, such leaven comes from shorter or longer periods that contribute to the growth of our faith. And we are just ahead of such a period that can be treated as a leaven, a conditioner.

This season is Advent, a joyful time of waiting for Christmas. Only God knows exactly how many Advents are left ahead of us. Has each of the experienced advents so far become a leaven of new life for us or resulted in an increase in faith, hope and love? Everyone has to answer this question for themselves. Whatever the answer may be, we all have another chance to experience Advent properly this time.

The prophet Isaiah tells us: “You, O LORD, are our father; “Our Redeemer” from of old is your name. O LORD, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand.” (Isaiah 63:16c; 64:7). Since we have a Redeemer whose coming will be celebrated in four weeks, we should use the time of waiting to prepare.

It is in this preparation that we are assisted by the Word heard in the liturgy of the Word throughout Advent. It depends on us what we will remember and what we will put into practice. After all, it is to us that St. Paul says: “I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind— just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you— so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ.” (1 Corinthians 1:4-7). We are enriched with everything, but we must work on ourselves for grace to bear visible fruit.

The Gospel words about the watch go to the very heart of the problem of preparation. Hearing about the need for vigilance, about the need to be vigilant, we should realize that these words refer to our readiness for the Lord's return, for Parousia. “Therefore, keep awake—for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly.” (Mark 13:35-36). We are to be ready always and at every moment, so that we can answer truthfully to the command “Stay awake” by saying: “we are watching, we are ready.”

Our readiness should not result from a sense of duty, but above all from love, hope, longing and waiting. We have to answer the question ourselves: are we ready?

Słowo Proboszcza

Zaczyn i oczekiwanie

Zaczyn to w mowie piekarzy i cukierników mała porcja specjalnej masy, która jest niezbędna do spulchnienia ciasta przygotowywanego do produkcji wypieków. W naszym życiu takim zaczynem są krótsze lub dłuższe okresy przyczyniające się do wzrostu naszej wiary. A właśnie jesteśmy przed takim okresem, który potraktować można jako zaczyn, spulchniacz.

Tym okresem jest Adwent, radosny czas oczekiwania na dzień Bożego Narodzenia. Tylko Bóg wie dokładnie, ile jeszcze pozostało przed nami Adwentów. Czy każdy z dotychczas przeżytych stał się dla nas zaczynem nowego życia, zaowocował wzrostem wiary, nadziei, miłości? Na to pytanie każdy musi sam sobie odpowiedzieć. Niezależnie od tego, jak odpowiedź będzie brzmiała, wszyscy otrzymujemy kolejną szansę dobrego przeżycia Adwentu.

Prorok Izajasz mówi nam: „Tyś, Panie, naszym Ojcem, „Odkupiciel nasz” to Twoje imię odwieczne. ... Panie, Tyś naszym Ojcem. Myśmy gliną, a Ty naszym twórcą. Dziełem rąk Twoich jesteśmy my wszyscy.” (Iz 63,16c;64,7). Skoro mamy Odkupiciela, którego przyjdzie będziemy świętować za cztery tygodnie, to powinniśmy wykorzystać czas oczekiwania na przygotowanie.

W tym właśnie przygotowaniu wspomaga nas Słowo wysłuchiwane podczas liturgii Słowa przez cały czas Adwentu. Od nas zależy, co zapamiętamy i co wprowadzimy w czyn. To przecież do nas św. Paweł mówi: „Bogu mojemu dziękuję wciąż za was, za łaskę daną wam w Chrystusie Jezusie. W Nim to bowiem zostaliście wzbogaceni we wszystko: we wszelkie słowo i wszelkie poznanie, bo świadectwo Chrystusowe utrwaliło się w was, tak iż nie brakuje wam żadnego daru łaski, gdy oczekujecie objawienia się Pana naszego Jezusa Chrystusa.” (1 Kor 1,4-7). Wzbogaceni jesteśmy we wszystko, ale musimy popracować nad sobą, by łaska wydała widoczne owoce.

Ewangeliczne słowa o czuwaniu trafiają w samo sedno problemu przygotowania. Słyszając o potrzebie czujności, o potrzebie czuwania, powinniśmy zdawać sobie sprawę z tego, że słowa te dotyczą naszej gotowości na ponowne przyjdzie Pana, na Paruzję. „Czuwajcie więc, bo nie wiecie, kiedy pan domu przyjdzie: z wieczora czy o północy, czy o pianiu kogutów, czy rankiem. By niespodzianie przyszedłszy, nie zastał was śpiących.” (Mk 13,35-36). Mamy być gotowi zawsze i w każdej chwili, abyśmy na polecenie „Czuwajcie” mogli odpowiedzieć zgodnie z prawdą: czuwamy, jesteśmy gotowi.

Nasza gotowość nie powinna wypływać z poczucia obowiązku, lecz przede wszystkim z miłości, nadziei, tęsknoty, oczekiwania. Musimy sobie sami odpowiedzieć na pytanie: czy jesteśmy już gotowi?

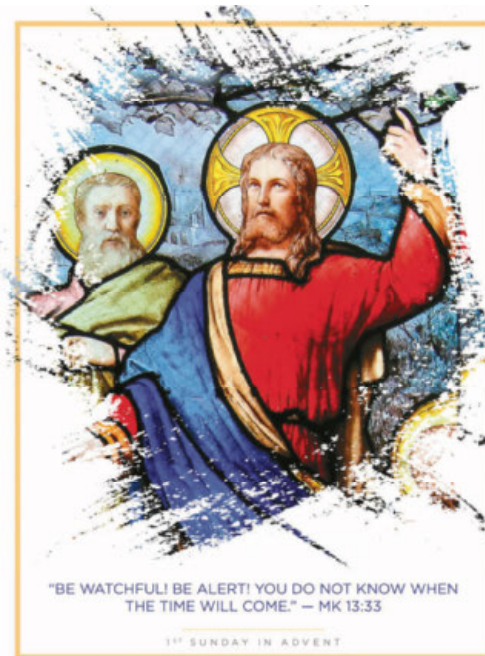

Oplatki Christmas Wafers

Oplatki Christmas Tradition

The tradition of the Oplatki originated in Poland during Early Christian times. This Christmas Custom began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water. The wafers are wonderfully designed to display Christmas images, such as the Nativity. The Oplatki are enjoyed by families, typically right before the Christmas Eve meal.

The entire family will gather around the table with the Oplatek. Generally the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the upcoming year – whether it be good health, success, or happiness. The purpose of this act is primarily to express ones unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family.

The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is in that it shadows the Eucharistic meal that Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share the love they have for one another.

Although this tradition is primarily enjoyed by the human members of the family, even the family pets can partake in this meal. Whereas the wafers are generally white in color, there are colored Oplatki made especially for pets. Although both colors are edible by people. Traditionally, this corresponds to the animals that were present at Christ's birth. However, in current times, this can also represent the important role that pets play in the family.

The Oplatki tradition is one that is easy and fun to introduce to the family at Christmas time. All it requires is a simple wafer paired with love and affection, and the willingness to share it. This is a heartwarming tradition that will complete your family's time together during the Christmas season.
